Like many communities, COVID had an impact across Clackamas County's shelter system. Clackamas County has three congregate shelters that primarily serve households with children. The three shelters each took a different approach during COVID: one closed entirely and supported households through hotel/motel vouchers only; one closed halfway, social distancing those remaining in the shelter and supporting others with hotel/motel vouchers; one remained open at full capacity with intensive cleaning, distancing, and mask-wearing protocols. All three shelters more-or-less maintained their same capacity in the 2020 sheltered count vs the 2021 sheltered count, resulting in similar PIT county numbers.

Over the past several years, shelter for adult-only households was only available from September through March, contingent on extreme or particularly cold weather conditions, provided in a congregate setting, and on a night-by-night basis. These congregate winter warming shelters for adult -only households were not open on the 2020 PIT count night, so they are not reflected on the 2020 HIC or PIT. This change in the way shelter was delivered resulted in a change in participation of programs, due to COVID-19.

This year Clackamas County received a waiver to use Coordinated Entry (CE) data, for those waiting for services on the point in time date, in lieu of a traditional unsheltered count. Based on the data, the CE system is more successful at reaching and screening families with children experiencing homelessness than the traditional PIT unsheltered count effort. There were 34 more households and 121 more people from families with children in the 2021 PIT count, compared with the 2019 PIT count.

There was a decrease from 187 to 150 households without children from the 2019 to the 2021 PIT count. This decrease can be attributed to the implementation of a RRH program dedicated to moving Chronically Homeless (CH) households, who met the FEMA definition of COVID-vulnerable, directly into Permanent Housing. The majority of those experiencing CH in Clackamas County are in adult-only households, and the program focused on those with the longest time homeless.
