OLD BUSINESS

1. ***River Report – Bill Taylor.***
 - Wild & Scenic Recreation Status for the Molalla approved by the US Senate, 92-8. Legislation is expected to pass the House. Bob Oblack asked about the effects of W & S legislation on rockhounding. It is not expected to impact it.
2. ***CPO Summit – Jan Courtain***

Jan reported that Clackamas County Compliance will investigate two anonymous or one name complaint. Inspectors are allowed to go on a property with reported violations. The next CPO Leaders meeting will be February 25th at Stonecliff Inn. Fran Taylor will attend to represent the Molalla CPO. Bob Oblack expressed concern that the county is aware of the increase of wells due to the increase in marijuana grows.
3. ***CCI – from Laurie Freeman Swanson***
 - Clackamas County will make a postal mailing list available to CPOs. They are considering putting a check box on tax assessments for the CPO.
 - Clackamas County is redoing their website.
 - The County is interested in seeing CPOs join in order to increase attendance.
 - An award will be awarded posthumously to Bob Reeves, an advocate for the Mt. Hood community who passed away in 2016. They plan to continue to give that award to a citizen that has shown outstanding citizen involvement.

NEW BUSINESS

1. ***Land Use—Jan Courtain.***
 - An application to replace a roof was approve by Clackamas County.
 - Z0043-19, an application for partition of 63 acres into three lots. The CPO chose not to comment.
