**BACKGROUND:**

Clackamas County Public Health Division (CCHPD) of the Health, Housing & Human Services Department requests the approval of an Amendment to the Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with Clackamas Fire District #1 to help support a community paramedic to the Project Hope Program.

This work is part of the Grant Subaward for Combating Opioid Overdose through Community-Level Intervention Initiative (COOCLI).

The Community Paramedic role will continue to provide crucial follow-up visits to opioid overdose survivors in the home after the emergency medical phase of the call ends. After an assessment is completed, Community Paramedics will provide care coordination between patients and providers and community resource navigation with a focus on treatment and recovery services (detox, inpatient, outpatient, and community-based

services). Community Paramedics will work with patients to establish a longer-term plan to prevent future substance use and potential overdose.

The Amendment value is \$11,200.00, bringing the maximum contract value to \$47,281.00. These funds are reallocated from Tualatin Valley Fire & Rescue Project Hope funds.

This Agreement is effective upon signature and continues through December 31, 2022.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends that the Board of County Commissioners approve the attached Amendment to the Intergovernmental Agreement with Clackamas Fire District for the Project Hope program.
