CALL TO ORDER

I. HOUSING AUTHORITY CONSENT AGENDA

- A. Approval of Amendment #1, adding time, scope of work, and funding, to the Construction Contract with Nomarco, Inc for the Housing Authority of Clackamas County Wide Flatwork Project. Amendment value is \$148,500 and 60 days, contract value is increased to \$476,500 for 240 days. Funding is through the Capital Fund Federal Grant and Housing Authority Local Project Funds. No County General Funds are involved.
- B. Approval of an Intergovernmental Agreement with Home Forward for continued Resident Services staff to expand programming for families living in Public Housing. Agreement value is \$114,950.13 for 1 year, with five 1-year renewal options. Funding is through Metro Supportive Housing Services Funds. No County General Funds are involved.
