The property is currently zoned County FU-10 and designated in the City's Comprehensive Plan for Low Density Residential. The property will be re-zoned to the City's R-10 Single Family Residential zone should annexation be approved. The City Commission has concluded that the proposal meets all state, regional and City requirements for annexation into the City and services can be adequately provided to the property. ## **EXPLANATORY STATEMENT (AN 14-01)**

This measure would expand the City boundaries by approximately 5.5 acres. The property is located at 19588 S. McCord Road on the southwest side of the city.

This petition for annexation was submitted to the City of Oregon City to allow connection to city services for existing and future development. The subject property is currently zoned by Clackamas County as FU-10 "Future Urbanizable," has an Oregon City Comprehensive Plan designation of "LDR" Low Density Residential and is located within the Portland Metropolitan Urban Growth Boundary (UGB).

Upon annexation, the property will be re-zoned to the City's R-10 Single Family Residential zone. No further development of the parcel would occur until a development application was approved by the City of Oregon City. The Oregon City Commission has reviewed the proposed annexation request and concluded that the proposal meets all state, regional and City requirements for annexation into the City and that all urban services, including water, sewer, transportation and similar services, can be adequately provided to the property.
