Question: Shall Canby Fire District maintain emergency response services by levying 45¢ per \$1,000 assessed value for five years, beginning 2016? This measure may cause property taxes to increase more than three percent.

Summary:

This proposed levy would replace a current local option levy that expires in 2016. The replacement levy would be used to retain four current Firefighter/Paramedics funded by the expiring levy and add two Firefighter/Paramedics during peak call times.

The District responds to over 2,200 fire and medical emergency calls each year. The percentage of overlapping calls has increased from 19% to over 30% in the past three years. This increase impacts the District's ability to provide an immediate response to all calls. The replacement levy would be used to fund two ambulance crews for rapid response during peak hours and improve response support when calls overlap.

The replacement levy rate is 45¢ per \$1,000 assessed property value, an increase of 11¢ over the current rate. For a typical property assessed at \$250,000, the annual cost would be approximately \$112, an increase of about \$27 per year. If the proposed levy fails, the existing levy will expire in 2016, at which time property taxes on a typical property would decline about \$112 per year.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT



The Canby Fire District (CFD) provides fire suppression, emergency medical response, ambulance transportation, community risk reduction, emergency preparation and management, and hazardous materials response services to the City of Canby, the City of Barlow, and a total of 54 square miles of surrounding suburban and rural areas.

CFD's mission is "Outstanding service to our community delivered with skilled professionalism and commitment to safety." CFD's shared vision is "Highly-skilled, efficient response to fire and medical emergencies and working together with our community to prevent the next emergency."

Why has this measure been placed on the ballot?

The current levy, which funds four Firefighter/Paramedics, expires in June 2016. This proposed levy would take the current levy's place and provide sufficient funding for CFD to retain existing staffing and add two more Firefighter/Paramedics during peak activity hours.

Why is additional staffing during peak activity hours being proposed?

CFD's response teams include EMTs and Paramedics with the ability to provide immediate life-saving care at medical and rescue incidents. The number of emergency response calls for CFD's services has increased from 1,731 in 2001 to 2,284 in 2014. Additionally, the percentage of simultaneous emergency response calls has increased from 19% to over 30% in the past three years. This increase in demand for CFD's services, combined with increasing overlap calls, challenges CFD's ability to respond in a quick and effective manner. The proposed addition of two Firefighter/Paramedics during peak activity hours would improve CFD's ability to provide fast and effective emergency response services during periods of high demand when volunteers might not be available.

What does the measure call for?

A "yes" vote would result in a local option levy tax rate of 45ϕ per thousand assessed property value, an increase of 11ϕ over the current rate. For property assessed at \$250,000 the cost would be approximately \$112 per year, an increase of about \$27 over the current local option levy.

A *"no"* vote would result in no replacement for the current local option levy, which expires in June 2016. The current local option levy funds four existing Firefighter/Paramedic positions.

What happens if the levy fails?

Without a replacement levy, CFD would continue to prioritize emergency response services, but would be required to eliminate a minimum of four firefighter/paramedic positions. Response challenges would also degrade the speed and effectiveness of CFD's emergency response services, especially in simultaneous call situations, because of the need to wait for back-up responders to arrive from Oregon City,

Wilsonville or West Linn. If the measure fails, taxes for a typical property with an assessed value of \$250,000 would decline by about \$112 per year.

What would be the total proposed tax rate for Canby Fire District?

\$1.54/\$1000. Permanent rate\$.45/\$1000. Proposed local option levy rate (being voted on)\$1.99/\$1000. Total Proposed Rate

The total proposed rate of \$1.99/\$1000 is lower than the average tax rate in Clackamas County for fire and emergency medical response services, which is estimated at \$2.15/\$1000.
