| Opioid Settlement Presentation-Mary Rumbaugh | CC is receiving the national settlement focused on mitigating harm due to opioid addiction. Oregon saw more that $50 \%$ increase in fatalities in a 1-year period. <br> > New funding over 18 years. Strategic interventions <br> $>$ Oregon will get 325 m and CC will be getting 13.7 m . First payment in July to front load $45 \%$ of those funds and the rest over the remaining years. <br> $>$ Save lives, evidence-based decisions, youth prevention, racial equity, fair and transparent process. <br> 9 abatement strategies <br> Mary gave examples of what the strategies are regarding the different areas of focus. <br> PH had already started listening to sessions regarding this topic and identify needs and service gaps across the service spectrum. BH would like to do some additional listening sessions. <br> $>$ Create steering committee. Have both internal and external representation. <br> $>$ Waiting to present proposal to BCC. | Mary will give more updates when proposal is approved. |

| Committee Reports - All | Advocacy/Legislative Committee - Mary said we are gearing up for long session. Lots of bills. Some to fix past bills and some for new investments. Address issues of statute regarding Aid \& Assist and protecting Local MH Authorities. <br> $>$ Nominating Committee - Voting for Exec Committee \& Open recruitment for expiring members. $1^{\text {st. }}$ : Teresa $2^{\text {nd: }}$ : Adam <br> $>$ Sub-Committee (Older Adult) - Sunny talked about a few articles regarding loneliness. <br> $\rightarrow$ Suicide Prevention Coalition of Clackamas County Update - This month we had a presentation from the postvention team-they do amazing work in the community support folks after a suicide. This is so important as postvention is the first step in prevention. Clackamas County does not yet have funding for postvention-this is extra work that folks are including. I would love to have our postvention folks present to our group, and perhaps discuss how the county might fund and expand this work. <br> $>$ Work Force Updates - Some providers are offering hiring bonuses. Bill passed for funding for provider to apply for funds to increase pay for workforce. Cascadia was awarded funds. Health share are increase their rates for services provided by providers for Medicaid members. <br> Director Update - Mary advised that HB 5205 was passed and allocated money to CC receiving 4.7 million. Mary presented proposal to state, and that the priority is for aid \& Assist. Looking to purchase a hotel. 30 rooms total. Partner with Supported housing for ongoing of program. Housing authority has property for sale and is more short term. Gave brief update of the BHRN's in CC. Mary will give a visual update at a future meeting. <br> 988 passed and launching on $7 / 16$. Lots to still figure out. Local crisis lines will continue to take calls. Lines for Life will be manning that line for the state of Oregon. | Jeffrey can present on postvention in CC. |
