OREGON ACCREDITATION ALLIANCE

General

1. The Oregon Accreditation Alliance (OAA) mutually supports and endorses the continued improvement of law enforcement and emergency communications services by establishing professional standards of accountability, management, and operations.
2. The OAA Board, which is composed of representatives from the Oregon Association Chiefs of Police, the Oregon State Sheriffs' Association and the Oregon Chapter of the Association of Public Safety Communications Officials, reviews and approves state accreditation, which assures the public on the application of specific professional standards and best practices.

Responsibilities

3. The CCSO is committed to acquiring and maintaining accreditation through the OAA. The Office's accreditation efforts will be coordinated through the Command Staff, who will monitor changes to applicable OAA accreditation requirements on behalf of the CCSO.
4. CCSO employees are encouraged to advise their supervisor on any changes to legislation and/or law enforcement practices that may affect current or future policies or procedures affecting the sustainment of CCSO accreditation.
