Renew current funding to prevent further cuts.

Our community values quality schools that are among Oregon's best, support high property values, and produce students who are successful in higher education and the workforce. Inadequate state funding and rising costs that continue to outpace revenue have resulted in painful cuts, including teacher reductions, school closures and consolidations, sale of the bus fleet, and deferred maintenance. Despite making prudent cuts, the district faces a \$2 million gap in the 2013-2015 biennium just to maintain the CV status quo.

How the School Levy Helps Lake Oswego Schools

The Lake Oswego School District supplements state revenues with the School Levy. LOSD voters have approved the Levy three times, generating critical support for the district, contributing to:

- <u>Protecting class sizes:</u> The Levy funds teachers, helping keep class sizes among the lowest in the
 area and allowing more focused and individualized instruction.
- <u>Higher achievement:</u> LO schools offer rich core and elective curricula at the secondary levels; elementary schools have maintained PE, music, and reading and math specialists. LO students score among the highest nationwide on the ACT and SAT. Elementary and junior high students outperform their peers across many subjects statewide.
- <u>Fewer teacher layoffs:</u> Monies generated by the Levy equal approximately 60-70 teaching positions. Loss of these positions would be devastating to the district.

How the School Levy Works

Renewal does not raise taxes – it extends what we already pay. It contributes approximately 10% of the district's annual operating revenue, roughly \$6 million. Citizens pay \$1.39 per \$1000 of assessed property value. Loss of the Levy would have a catastrophic effect on the quality of LO schools. Our children deserve an education that prepares them to be successful adults and contributors to our community.

The local school levy is a critical component of the Lake Oswego School District budget --ensuring continued excellence in our local schools. The levy renewal will:

- Preserve 10% of our schools' budget; without the local levy there would be a \$6.0 million shortfall in the current. budget,
- All funds from the local levy go directly to the Lake Oswego schools, providing local control and maintaining the superior quality of each school in the district.
- Lake Oswego schools consistently have smaller class sizes than most other Portland metro area districts, and each school in the LOSD has received the State's top rating for six consecutive years -- the local school levy is a critical component to maintaining our excellence in education
- > Our community stood together and renewed our school levy twice since the original approval in 2000. It's time to stand together again and do what's right for our children and our community's future: voting Yes to renew our school levy.

For over two decades, local control over school funding has been steadily eroded, and the state legislature does not provide responsible funding for our local schools. The Lake Oswego local option fills this funding gap, ensuring that we will maintain the high level of programs and low class sizes that Lake Oswego is known for.

For many families, the decision to live in the Lake Oswego area is often driven by our high quality public schools.
