Dear Clackamas County Voter:

This Voters' Pamphlet contains information about candidates and measures which are on our March Special Election ballot. We will be electing directors for all the cemetery, fire, recreation, sanitary, school, transportation and water districts. There are also measures in two cities and one school district. No arguments for or against a measure were filed.

Sixty-two candidates purchased space for a picture and/or a candidate statement. This Voters' Pamphlet contains basic information about all candidates as provided on the candidate's filing form.

PLEASE UNDERSTAND this pamphlet covers **ALL** of Clackamas County. Your ballot will contain only those candidates and measures for which you are eligible to vote, based on where you live.

Even though all elections to be held in 1995 will be conducted by mail, an application for absentee ballot form is provided on page 4. In 1996, we will have Primary and General elections which may be held at polling places and you may request **PERMANENT** absentee status by sending this form to us ahead of time.

The Oregon Legislature is meeting now and several pieces of legislation relate to elections and voting. I believe many of these bills will provide for greater voter participation, reduced cost of elections and more efficient processes. Senate Bill 319 would allow us to conduct Primary and General Elections by mail. Another cost-saving bill is Senate Bill 174 which would require school districts to conduct their director elections once every two years rather than each year as they do now.

Page 79 of this Voters' Pamphlet contains the room and phone numbers for Clackamas County Senators and Representatives. I encourage you to contact your legislator to express your opinions on these and other bills. The form of address is: The Honorable (Senator/Representative) _____, (Room #) State Capitol, Salem, OR 97310. There is also a toll free number you can use to leave a brief message with your legislator: 1-800-332-2313.

BALLOT TITLE

THREE-YEAR OPERATING SERIAL LEVY FOR PUBLIC SAFETY SERVICES

QUESTION: Shall Milwaukie levy \$858,000 each year for three years outside the tax base for public safety services beginning in 1995-1996?

SUMMARY: If approved, the levy will be used to provide matching funds for the COPSFAST program, a part of the 1994 Crime Bill. The matching funds make the City eligible for a federal grant. With the grant, three more police officers will be hired. The levy also funds the purchase of and repairs to police equipment.

Also, passage of this levy allows the Fire-Rescue Department to stay at its current service level. Funds from this levy will replace a levy for fire-rescue services that ends on June 30, 1995. Services continued by this levy include funding for fire fighters to operate two engine companies out of two fire stations. It also funds purchase and repairs to fire equipment.

The total amount of the serial levy would be \$2,574,000 over a three year period. The estimated tax rate for this levy is \$0.7826 for this levy. The estimated tax cost for this measure is an ESTIMATE ONLY based on the best information available from the County Tax Assessor at the time of the estimate.

The tax levy is subject to the limits of Section 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution and the revenues raised will be used for governmental purposes other than schools.

Approval of this measure may reduce the property tax collections of other non-school district units of government available under the provisions of Section 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution and implementing legislation.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

The proposed Public Safety Serial Levy for the City of Milwaukie provides funding for both the Milwaukie Fire-Rescue Department and the Milwaukie Police Department.

The Milwaukie Fire-Rescue Department includes 24 firefighters and the Fire Chief. The Department operates two fire engines and a rescue vehicle from two fire stations. This equipment is available twenty-four hours per day, three hundred and sixty-five days per year. In 1994, Milwaukie's Fire-Rescue Department responded to 1,338 alarms. This total includes 340 fire calls, 797 first aid-rescue calls, and 201 calls for other assistance.

The proposed levy pays for nine firefighters. Without the nine firefighters, one fire engine would be placed in reserve and operations may have to be consolidated to a single location to improve efficiency. The levy also includes funding for overtime pay for calling back off-duty firefighters when additional assistance is needed. In addition, the levy includes funding for training, supplies and small equipment replacement and repair.

The proposed levy would provide the City of Milwaukie funds to hire three additional police officers. On September 13, 1994 President Clinton signed Public Law 103-322, the Violent Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act of 1994. A significant feature of this act was federal funding assistance for community policing activities. The act provides federal reimbursement for seventy-five percent of the base salary costs of police officers added to the existing police force. The funds from the levy would provide the City's match of twenty-five percent of base salary costs, all extra salary costs including overtime expenses, all benefit costs and costs of supplies and equipment. The additional police officers would be incorporated into the community policing efforts of the City.

BALLOT TITLE

THREE-YEAR OPERATING SERIAL LEVY FOR LIBRARY SERVICES

QUESTION: Shall Milwaukie levy \$200,000 each year for three years outside the tax base for library services beginning in 1995-1996?

SUMMARY: The Ledding Library has provided service to the people of the City of Milwaukie for nearly thirty years. The library has over 98,900 books, tapes, videos and other items in its circulation. The annual circulation of these items is in excess of 300,000. Passage of this levy allows Ledding Library to stay at its current service levels. The library would continue to be open on Sundays and Thursday evenings. In addition, the levy would pay for reference resources and lease or purchase of best selling books. The proposed levy replaces a levy approved by the voters on June 30, 1992. That levy ends on June 30, 1995. The total amount of the serial levy would be \$600,000 over a three-year period.

The estimated tax rate for this levy is \$0.1824 for this levy. The estimated tax cost for this measure is an ESTIMATE ONLY based on the best information available from the County Tax Assessor at the time of estimate.

The tax levy is subject to the limits of Section 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution, and the revenues raised will be used for governmental purposes other than schools.

Approval of this measure may reduce the property tax collections of other non-school district units of government available under the provisions of Section 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution and implementing legislation.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

This levy will allow the Ledding Library to be open 53 hours per week:

Monday - Thursday	11 am - 8 pm
Friday - Saturday	11 am - 5:30 pm
Sunday	1pm - 5 pm

This schedule provides six new hours of public service in the mornings. Reference service will become available on evenings and weekends. The number of library programs for pre-school children will double.

Without this levy, the library would be open 40.5 hours per week. The library would no longer be open on Sundays or on Thursday evenings. The proposed hours of library service in the mornings would not be implemented.

If the library hours are reduced, the library would be open fewer hours than any of the other major libraries in the area. This could affect circulation and may reduce the county funding paid to the library on the basis of circulation.

This levy will allow the library to continue to provide a wide range of materials. The levy would provide 50 percent of the new materials purchase budget. The new materials purchase budget includes: newspapers, magazines, compact discs, videos, children's audio visual materials, and new books. Without the levy, new materials and subscriptions would be reduced.

GRESHAM-BARLOW SCHOOL DISTRICT

Measure No. 26-27

BALLOT TITLE

NOMINATION OF FOUR DIRECTORS FROM ZONES AND THREE AT-LARGE

QUESTION: Shall the district be zoned, with four directors nominated from zones, and three nominated at-large, all elected at-large?

SUMMARY: Measure authorizes school board to divide district into four zones as nearly equal in population as practicable, considering attendance areas where possible. Each zone would be represented by a director living in that zone but elected by all electors of the district. Three directors would be nominated and elected at-large, and could live anywhere in the district. The school board would adjust the zone boundaries following any change of district boundaries or a federal census.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

The Board of Directors of the Gresham-Barlow School District has placed a measure on the March 28, 1995, election ballot. If approved by the voters, the measure would create four zoned positions and three at-large positions for the seven seats on the School District Board.

Question:

Why did the Board decide to place the measure on the March 28 election ballot?

Answer:

The Board did so because there was a recommendation to hold an election included in the Gresham-Barlow District unification plan which the Board had previously approved and which the Board had pledged to implement, if possible.

Question:

How many zones will there be if the measure is approved?

Answer:

Under the proposal, there would be four zones and four of the seven Board positions would be assigned to a zone. In order to run for a zoned position, a person would have to live within that particular geographic zone. For the other three Board positions, a candidate could live anywhere in the district (i.e. be at-large). Whether the position is zoned or at-large, all registered voters within the district would be entitled to vote on all positions.

Question:

Generally, what are the areas covered by the zones?

Answer:

Three of the proposed zones encompass much of the area of the former Gresham Grade School District (i.e. within what is generally thought of as the City of Gresham); the fourth zone encompasses what were formerly the Orient, Damascus, Boring Districts and the northeastern part of the Gresham Grade School District. Maps are available. Remember, the other three Board positions are at-large and represent no zones.

Question:

What will be the impact if Board zones are approved by the voters?

Answer:

Some believe that zones will guarantee representation from all areas of the District; others believe that zones may limit the number of qualified candidates from certain parts of the District.

Still others believe that if a person lives in a particular zone, that person may be overly diligent in representing the interests of that zone rather than what is in the interest of the District as a whole.

There is no financial impact.

Question:

Why was the particular zone configuration currently being considered selected in the first place?

Answer:

By law, zones must be as equal as possible in terms of population (using data from the most recent Federal census). Any number of configurations could be developed, but because the majority of the population within the District lives within what is thought of as the city of Gresham, the outermost areas of the District together would have only one zone, no matter what the configuration.

Question:

Are other school districts in the area zoned? What has been their experience?

Answer:

Some districts in this area are zoned; the majority are not. There is no evidence as to whether or not a zoned district is better for students or is more representative of the interests of District patrons.

CITY OF TUALATIN

Measure No. 34-28

BALLOT TITLE

CITY OF TUALATIN BOND ELECTION FOR COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

QUESTION: Shall the City issue \$15 million in General Obligation Bonds for a Community Improvement Program? If the bonds are approved, they will be payable from taxes on property, or property ownership, that are not subject to the limits of Section 11B, Article XI, of the Oregon Constitution.

SUMMARY: The Bonds will be for a term not more than 25 years. Funds from the Bonds will be used to build and equip community facilities. The facilities to be built include an expanded Library, a new city hall & police facility, a community center, and an aquatics & youth center.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

The measure would authorize the issuance of \$15 million in General Obligation Bonds to fund the Community Improvement Program. The bonds would be issued for 25 years and repaid by an annual property tax levy. It is estimated that the first year amount of the tax levy for repayment of the bond would be \$1.01 per \$1,000 assessed value. This amount would decline in future years as the assessed value in the City increased.

The proposed Community Improvement Program includes the following elements:

Community Center — \$1.8 million: This 14,000 square foot facility would be located adjacent to the public plaza in Tualatin Commons. It would include: space for community meetings and classes, performing arts, business meetings, weddings, and other celebrations. It would include the offices of the Tualatin Chamber of Commerce with the Chamber either purchasing the space or paying monthly rent. The community center would also include ground floor retail space which would help offset the operating costs of the facility.

City Hall & Police Facility — \$3.6 million: This 26,000 square foot facility would provide space for the majority of City departments, including the police. Construction of this facility would allow removal of the present police building and completion of the parking area for Tualatin Commons. It also allows for improvement to the intersection of Seneca Street and the off-set access to Safeway/K-Mart by removing the current Council Building. The proposed cost includes site acquisition.

Library Expansion — \$350,000: The existing library would be expanded, as originally planned, from its 9,455 square feet to 16,000 square feet by remodeling the space currently occupied by City offices.

Combined Aquatics and Youth Center — \$9 million: This 60,000 - 70,000 square foot facility would include: two pools, a 25-yard competitive pool and a leisure pool; a gymnasium, youth drop-in area; classrooms; and provisions for recreational programming for youth. The proposed cost includes site acquisition.

The bond measure provides \$250,000 for bond issuance costs which include the notice of bond sale, bond rating services, bond counsel and financial advisory services, preparation of the Official Statement for potential investors, and the printing of the bonds.

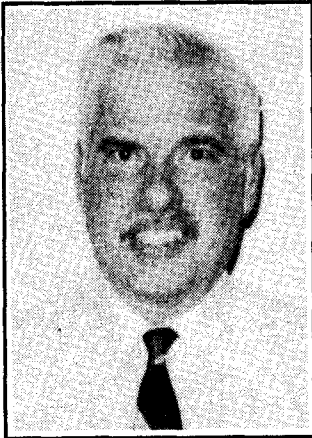
- A resolution mandating that all cuts in the school budget come from administrative and overhead costs, and not from programs which effect our children's right to receive a good education.
- A resolution recommending the salary of the new Superintendent, and any new Deputy Superintendent, be reduced. Currently, these two positions have a combined salary of \$169,553.00. This cannot be justified while our children continue to see their educational opportunities cut.
- A resolution requiring that absolutely no education dollars be spent on attempting to coerce voters to pass a new bond. The voters in NC12 have spoken; they want quality schools without being forced to support new bonds. The District should follow the will of the voters.

When I graduated from Putnam in 1980, I was able to go to college and then to law school in large part because of the high quality education I received. Our children today deserve no less. I ask for your support. Thank you.

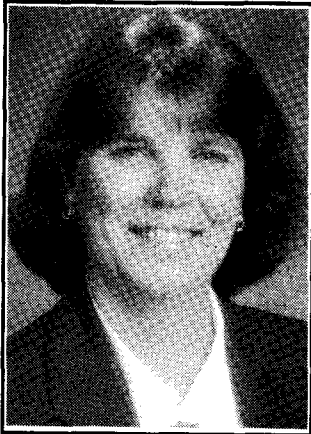

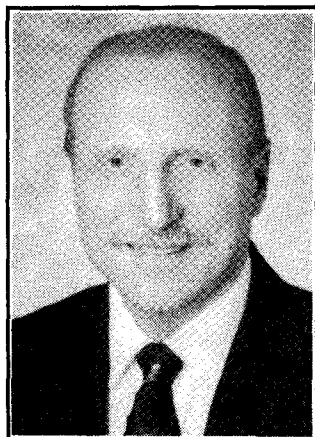

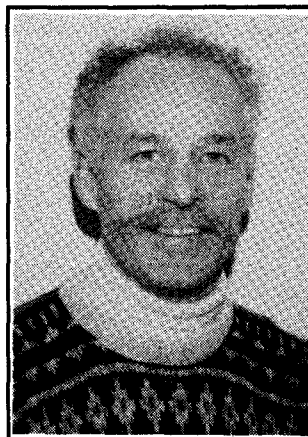

The early years of education are too precious to waste; classes greater than 20 are developmentally inappropriate and poor educational practice. I am committed to seeing that class sizes in our District are lowered to 20 or less.

As a Board member, I'll continue to lobby Salem for adequate funding for necessary programs and will keep fighting for fiscal responsibility in our local budgets.

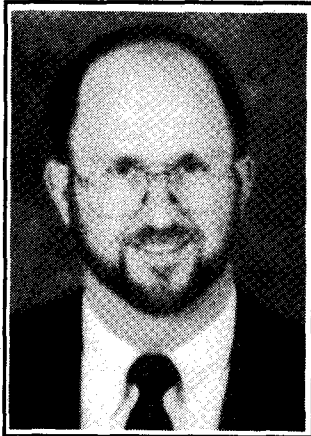

I have a great admiration for Hoodland Fire District's Volunteer Organization and I feel it is extremely important that we continue to support our volunteers, we cannot do without them.

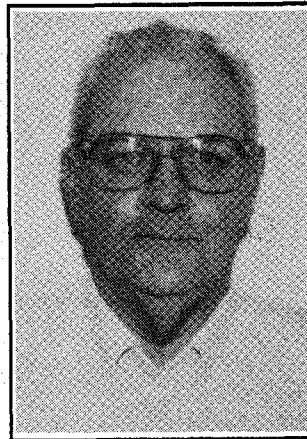

There are many challenges facing the water industry today. These range from new regulations concerning water quality to changing legislation regarding water rights and availability. This will necessitate changes in the way water districts and municipal water departments operate. Being government entities, however, change does not always come easily. As a government employee in the water-works industry, I recognize some of the difficulties involved and am able to lessen the impact of political and bureaucratic barriers.

One of the major issues facing us locally is the proposed regionalization of the Clackamas River basin. There are those who would have us believe that one large, main source of supply is in our best interest. Others foster a theory of 1 or 2 additional treatment plants. This would afford redundancy and back-up capabilities while providing service that is geographically closer to customers. There are valid arguments for and against both sides of this issue. The rational approach is to proceed deliberately but prudently. While effective change in government may be troublesome to achieve, it may be more difficult to rectify when not done correctly.

Currently, I hold state certifications in water distribution, waste water collection, backflow and cross connection inspection and testing, and public pesticide applications.
