## 525 Portland Avenue, Gladstone, OR **Property Assessment**

### Background

The identified site for the new Gladstone Library is planned for 525 Portland Ave, Gladstone Oregon. Currently the home of the Gladstone City Hall, the building will become vacant with the opening of the new Gladstone Civic Center, planned for opening in mid-2020. At that time, the current Gladstone City Hall and Police Department will relocate to the Gladstone Civic Center, currently under construction. The current building is be planned for demolition (date to be determined) to make way for the new Gladstone Library, currently located across East Dartmouth Street.

The future home of the new Gladstone Library is a 9,000 sf (.207 acre) lot, situated at the NE corner of the intersection of Portland Avenue and E. Dartmouth Street. Owned by the City of Gladstone, the City Hall building was originally designed by Architect J.D. Annand and built in 1941. Constructed as a 61 ft x 41 ft lightly-reinforced concrete structure with interior post-and-beam construction, the two-story building originally housed many city services – Library, City Hall (City Recorder and City Council chamber) in addition to Fire Station complete with firefighter living quarters, two fire-truck apparatus bays, plus two additional bays for road and water equipment. Subsequent construction of a new Fire Station to the adjacent property to the north, and larger Library building across E. Dartmouth St. to the south in 1961 resulted in building additions and remodel of the current building, which now contains City Hall functions and the Gladstone Police Department. The City Hall currently abuts a 40 ft. length of-wall of the Gladstone Fire Station, which was seismically upgraded in 2010. This wall extends along the eastern half of the north property line.

Within the City of Gladstone jurisdiction, the property resides within the Community Commercial District, zoned Commercial C-2.

#### **Considerations for Site Development**

Per the Oregon State Historic Database, the Gladstone City Hall building is currently not designated as either an *eligible* or *contributing* historic resource. However, consultation with the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) should be undertaken prior to demolition of the property, as the building age exceeds 50 years and is currently under public ownership. This will require the time necessary to do basic research in order to submit the history / time frame / past uses of the building for determination from SHPO if a separate Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is required to be undertaken regarding agreement and determination of mitigation measures.

As previously noted, the current City Hall building shares a common wall line with the adjacent Fire Station. Documentation of the Fire Station seismic upgrade indicates these walls are separate and the Fire Station exterior wall is not expected to be impacted by the deconstruction of the current City Hal wall or construction of the new library. However, the existing wall to the east, abutting the elevated grade along the shared lot line with the apartment complex, is expected to require bracing to retain the soil when the existing City Hall is demolished. Cost and schedule should plan for bracing during deconstruction, and reconstruction of a permanent retaining wall as part of the new library construction.

Per the Phase I Environmental Assessment undertaken by PBS Engineering in June 2019, findings report two identified issues to take into consideration with further site development – potential environmental concerns with auto repair use from 1917-1941 (prior to construction of the current City Hall), and discovery of a vent pipe on the south side of the structure, which could indicate presence of an underground storage tank. 2019 survey information provided by NCPRD indicates an underground oil tank located within the public right-of-way.
