The Housing and Community Development Division of the Health, Housing and Human Services Department requests the approval to apply for annual CoC Program funding through HUD to fund CoC program activities for 2023-2024. Clackamas County CoC is the Lead Agency responsible for completing the CoC Consolidated Application for CoC funding.

BACKGROUND:

Each year, HUD makes CoC funding available for the following fiscal year's programs through a Notice of Funding Opportunity available for multiple homeless services projects delivered by local agencies, including both the County and external partners. The various CoC projects together comprise of the federally funded CoC system of care for those experiencing homelessness in Clackamas County.

HUD requires CoC lead agencies to host a local competition for competitive funding as well as the application process for non-competitive awards. On August 31, 2022, Clackamas County closed to applicants for local projects. All applications for competitive awards will be scored and ranked for funding based on HUD specific thresholds as well local criteria established by the local CoC Steering Committee. Applications for the non-competitive Youth Homelessness Demonstration Program (YHDP) and CoC Planning Activities funding will not be ranked but will be verified to meet HUD thresholds.

In addition, the CoC lead agency must complete consolidated application questions related to the effectiveness of our County's homeless service response.

Through the consolidated application process, the County will be applying for funding to administer the following programs through the Clackamas County Department of Health, Housing, and Human Services and Housing Authority of Clackamas County (HACC):

- Housing our Heroes
- Coordinated Housing Access
- Housing our Families
- HOPE 2
- HOPE Leasing
- Rent Well Rapid Rehousing
- Homeless Management Information System (HMIS)
- OR-507 CoC Planning Activities
- Shelter + Care (S+C) HACC

The timeline for applying for funding through the Consolidated Application was greatly condensed this year by HUD, which allowed only two months instead of the usual three months, from the issuance of the notice of funding to the application deadline. In addition,

many of the detailed instructions for applying this year have also been delayed. Staff has been working diligently to ensure the CoC application is completed on time and that funding continues for these critical programs impacting our most vulnerable neighbors.

- CoC issues NOFO to provider networks for projects to apply for funding

- CoC Steering Committee Scores projects applying for competitive awards & compiles their Prioritization List
- CoC completes application questions
- Deadline to submit complete consolidated application package in HUD's online portal is September 30, 2022 at 5pm

FY 2022 Continuum of Care Competition and Noncompetitive Award of Youth Homeless Demonstration Program Renewal and Replacement Grants

Program Description. The Continuum of Care (CoC) Program (24 CFR part 578) is designed to promote a community-wide commitment to the goal of ending homelessness; to provide funding for efforts by nonprofit providers, states, Indian Tribes or tribally designated housing entities (as defined in section 4 of the Native American Housing Assistance and Self-Determination Act of 1996 (25 U.S.C. 4103) (TDHEs)), and local governments to quickly rehouse homeless individuals, families, persons fleeing domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking, and youth while minimizing the trauma and dislocation caused by homelessness; to promote access to and effective utilization of mainstream programs by homeless individuals and families, and to optimize self-sufficiency among those experiencing homelessness.

The goal of the Youth Homelessness Demonstration Program (YHDP) is to support the development and implementation of a coordinated community approach to preventing and ending youth homelessness and sharing that experience with and mobilizing communities around the country toward the same end. The population to be served by the demonstration program is youth experiencing homelessness, including unaccompanied and pregnant or parenting youth.

Deadline: The deadline for submitting applications to HUD for the FY 2022 CoC Program Competition is 8:00 PM EDT on September 30, 2022. Applicants must complete and submit their applications in *e-snaps* at https://esnaps.hud.gov/.

Preference Points: This NOFO does not offer preference points.
