Approval of Amendment #14, adjusting FY2022 and 2023 funding and updating program language to a Revenue Intergovernmental Agreement with Oregon Health Authority (OHA) for the financing of Public Health Services. This Amendment increases FY2022 by \$44,871.07 and increases FY2023 by \$1,418,744.50. Agreement value is increased to \$\$18,543,085.71. for 2 years. Funding is through OHA Federal and State grants. **No County General Funds are involved.**

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: The Clackamas County Public Health Division (CCPHD) of the Health, Housing & Human Services Department requests the approval of Amendment #14 with Oregon Health Authority (OHA) for Operation as the Local Public Health Authority (LPHA) increasing funding and updating program element language.

Funding through this Amendment allows the Clackamas County Public Health Division (CCPHD) to continue to provide public health-related services to Clackamas County residents. Award adjustments are made periodically over the course of the Agreement based on quarterly reports submitted.

Amendment #14 increases FY-22 PE40-01 WIC NSA: July - September by \$44,871.07, FY-23 increases PE03-02 by \$52,337, PE44-03 COVID COAG Funds by \$100,092.50, and increases PE 51-05 CDC PH Infrastructure Funding by \$1,266,315.00. The total contract value is \$18,543,085.71 for 2 years.

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Per the OHA, Amendment #14 is effective on March 1, 2023, through June 20, 2023, regardless of the date signed.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the Board approve Amendment #14 to the Intergovernmental Agreement #10213.

FOURTEENTH AMENDMENT TO OREGON HEALTH AUTHORITY 2021-2023 INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT FOR THE FINANCING OF PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICES

This Fourteenth Amendment to Oregon Health Authority 2021-2023 Intergovernmental Agreement for the Financing of Public Health Services, effective July 1, 2021, (as amended and restated the "Agreement"), is between the State of Oregon acting by and through its Oregon Health Authority ("OHA") and Clackamas County, ("LPHA"), the entity designated, pursuant to ORS 431.003, as the Local Public Health Authority for Clackamas County.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, OHA and LPHA wish to modify the Fiscal Year 2022 (FY22) Financial Assistance Award set forth in Exhibit C of the Agreement.

WHEREAS, OHA and LPHA wish to modify the Fiscal Year 2023 (FY23) Financial Assistance Award set forth in Exhibit C of the Agreement.

WHEREAS, OHA and LPHA wish to modify the Exhibit J information required by 2 CFR Subtitle B with guidance at 2 CFR Part 200 (FY22);

WHEREAS, OHA and LPHA wish to modify the Exhibit J information required by 2 CFR Subtitle B with guidance at 2 CFR Part 200 (FY23);

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises, covenants and agreements contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto agree as follows

AGREEMENT

- 1. This Amendment is effective on March 1, 2023, regardless of the date this amendment has been fully executed with signatures by every Party and when required, approved by the Department of Justice. However, payments may not be disbursed until the Amendment is fully executed.
- **2.** The Agreement is hereby amended as follows:
 - **a.** Section 1 of Exhibit C of the Agreement entitled "Financial Assistance Award" for FY22 is hereby superseded and replaced in its entirety by Attachment A, entitled "Financial Assistance Award (FY22)", attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. Attachment A must be read in conjunction with Section 3 of Exhibit C of the Agreement.
 - b. Section 1 of Exhibit C of the Agreement, entitled "Financial Assistance Award" for FY23 is hereby superseded and replaced in its entirety by Attachment B, entitled "Financial Assistance Award (FY23)", attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. Attachment B must be read in conjunction with Section 3 of Exhibit C.
 - c. Exhibit J of the Agreement entitled "Information required by 2 CFR Subtitle B with guidance at 2 CFR Part 200" (FY22) is amended to add to the federal award information datasheet as set forth in Attachment C, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.
 - **d.** Exhibit J of the Agreement entitled "Information required by 2 CFR Subtitle B with guidance at 2 CFR Part 200" (FY23) is amended to add to the federal award information datasheet as set forth in Attachment D, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.
- 3. LPHA represents and warrants to OHA that the representations and warranties of LPHA set forth in Section 4 of Exhibit F of the Agreement are true and correct on the date hereof with the same effect as if made on the date hereof.
- 4. Capitalized words and phrases used but not defined herein shall have the meanings ascribed thereto in the Agreement.
- **5.** Except as amended hereby, all terms and conditions of the Agreement remain in full force and effect.
- 6. This Amendment may be executed in any number of counterparts, all of which when taken together shall constitute one agreement binding on all parties, notwithstanding that all parties are not signatories to the same counterpart. Each copy of this Amendment so executed shall constitute an original.
