The Clackamas County Board of Commissioners support Ziply Fiber's application for the Oregon Business Office's (OBO) Broadband Deployment Program grant. We value Ziply's mission to connect communities and empower individuals through high-quality broadband services.

Ziply Fiber is a telecommunications company serving our community. Today, service is delivered on legacy copper and in places fiber optic network infrastructure. Ziply Fiber is an Eligible Telecommunications Carrier (ETC), in the State of Oregon. As an ETC they provide access to federal Lifeline and Oregon Telephone Assistance Program subsidies for low-income qualifying households.
