














































THE MONTH OF THE MANAGER



KIDS, IF YOU'RE WORRIED ABOUT SOMEONE YOU KNOW WHO'S STRUGGLING WITH DRUGS OR ALCOHOL, HERE ARE SOME THINGS YOU CAN DO TO HELP!

- · Most important: Keep yourself safe.
- If you're aware that someone who has been drinking is driving, call 911.
- Never confront your friend/family member while they're drunk or high.
- If your friend/family member becomes angry or violent, leave and bring the subject up later when he/she is calm.
- You can always turn to an adult for help (mom/dad, grandma/grandpa, aunt/uncle, school counselor, neighbor, police).
- Trust your instincts. If something doesn't feel right, it isn't right.
- Share your love and concern for your friend/brother/sister and urge them not to drink and not to drink and drive.
- You can say, "I am worried about you, I care about you," and/or "I don't want you to get hurt."
- How you say something is just as important as what you say. A supportive, caring tone works best.
- Health, Housing & Human Services
- If your friend/brother/sister doesn't listen, keep trying different strategies: Take their keys away (only if it's safe), contact parents and/or the police, or tell the nearest adult.
- Keep telling people until you get the help you need.
- \bullet Call the national hotline at 1-800-788-2800 (7 days a week, 24 hours a day).
- Remember: Your friend/family member's drug use is not your fault!
