Summary 175 words which concisely and impartially summarizes the measure and its major effect.					
State law allows operation of registered medical marijuana processors, medical marijuana dispensaries and licensed recreational marijuana producers, processors, wholesalers, and retailers. State law provides that a city council may adopt an ordinance to be referred to the voters to prohibit the establishment of any of those registered or licensed activities. Approval of this measure would prohibit the establishment and operation of medical marijuana processors, medical marijuana dispensaries, recreational marijuana producers, processors, wholesalers, and retailers within the area subject to the jurisdiction of the city. However, state law would allow the continued operation of processors and dispensaries already registered – or in some cases, that have applied to be registered –that have successfully completed a land use review. This measure will not affect personal recreational and medical use of marijuana. If this measure is approved, the city will be ineligible to receive distributions of state marijuana tax revenues and will be unable to impose a local tax or fee on the production, processing or sale of marijuana or any product into which marijuana has been incorporated.

Measure Explanatory Statement for County Voters' Pamphlet 2016 AUG 22 PM04:11:52

Approval of this measure would prohibit the establishment and operation of marijuana businesses within the city.

ORS 475B.400 to 475B.525 provides that the Oregon Health Authority will register medical marijuana processors and medical marijuana dispensaries. Medical marijuana processors compound or convert marijuana into concentrates, extracts, edible products, and other products intended for human consumption and use. Medical marijuana dispensaries facilitate the transfer of marijuana and marijuana products between patients, caregivers, processors, and growers.

ORS 475B.005 to 475B.399 provides that the Oregon Liquor Control Commission will license recreational marijuana producers (those who manufacture, plant, cultivate, grow or harvest marijuana), processors, wholesalers, and retailers.

ORS 475B.800 authorizes cities to ban any or all of those marijuana entities within the city by adopting an ordinance and referring it to the voters at a statewide general election. The Oregon City Commission has adopted an ordinance prohibiting the establishment of all marijuana businesses within the city and, as a result, has referred this measure to the voters.

If approved, this measure would prohibit medical marijuana processors, medical marijuana dispensaries as well as recreational marijuana producers, processors, wholesalers, and retailers within the city. Medical marijuana processors and medical marijuana dispensaries that were registered with the state before the city council adopted the ordinance, and medical marijuana dispensaries that had applied to be registered on or before July 1, 2015, can continue operating in the city even if this measure is approved, if those entities have successfully completed a local land use application process.

Approval of this measure has revenue impacts. Currently, ten percent of state marijuana tax revenues will be distributed to cities to assist local law enforcement in performing their duties under ORS 475B.760(2). If approved, this measure would make the city ineligible to receive distributions of state marijuana tax revenues.

Currently, under ORS 475B.345, a city may impose up to a three percent tax on the sale of marijuana items by a marijuana retailer in the city. However, if this measure is approved and Oregon City prohibits the establishment of any marijuana business, the city will not be able to impose a local tax or fee on those activities.
