 Advisory

- PTA (Parent Teacher Association) Parents have a lot of influence
- <u>Lines for Life</u> (used to have A&D prevention in schools, currently have youth line)
- 2018 <u>ODE Standards for Curriculum</u> includes health, mental health, substance use & suicide where does certain curriculum have to happen?
 - Work with <u>Pam Pearce</u> & her continuum on leveraging existing work on prevention strategies
- Sandy HS partners with other districts to offer QPRs (Sarah Hiatt)

Means Safety

- Continue to distribute free items to reduce access to lethal means (gun locks, lock boxes, etc.)
 - o Continue to pursue funding

 - Primary Care Social Supervisors
- Partner with Oregon Firearm Safety Coalition
- Engaging firearm community directly find ways to listen to & address concerns
