The Supported Employment Team would like to take a moment and remember a man, who above all odds managed to successfully gain employment and work his way off all benefits. Although he is no longer with us, his story brings joy and light to our memories on a daily basis. This is a great reminder to never give up on your goals, and all is possible.

This Supported Employment client showed us what a great human can do when they put all their energy into their goals. The experience of his life and drive is one of great joy and hope, in a time where it can be easy to become pessimistic or lose hope. Through all situations, this man was patient, open, and communicative with great candor.

He came in suffering with an SPMI diagnosis, causing social isolation, a sedentary lifestyle, and some unhelpful habits affecting his mental

health and overall health. He was living alone, dependent on SSDI, food stamps, and subsidized housing. During his time in treatment, he worked very methodically to tackle smaller goals, one after another. He started small and every subsequent goal was a little larger. He communicated well and discussed successes and where he might improve and increase the efficiency of his efforts. He began living a routine, building an active lifestyle, increasing social time, managing his medications better, and decreasing unhelpful habits. The results were his mood and motivation increased. With time, he decided to get back into the work force and pursued a pharmacy tech certification. He began working as a pharmacy tech, and shortly after decided he wanted to work his way off SSDI and all other assistances so that he could be fully independent. He experienced challenges and setbacks including a rigorous work schedule, working with his providers to find a work-life balance, having his car totaled on the way to work, and then replacing it. Despite these challenges, he was successful in his goal to be fully independent. He was paying all his bills, a little behind at first, but his rational approach kept him grounded and focused on what he could do in each moment. Our second to last session, I told him "Every time you come to the plate, you hit a homerun. It is wonderful to see, you are one in a million. I don't expect a homerun every time, and you continue to hit them. Keep up the great work". His response was "Well, I am grateful to Cindy, Karen, Kim and you for all the support helping me get to where I am. It feels really good to have come all this way."
