EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The Social Services Division of the Department of Health, Housing and Human Services requests approval to apply to Oregon Department of Transportation Rail and Public Transit Division to fund Mt Hood Transit Enhancements.

Clackamas County has been awarded \$850,000 as part of the FY2024 Congressionally Directed Spending/Community Project funding package for the project "Mt Hood Transit Enhancements" (FTA project ID 2024-CMPJ-107). These funds are to develop and construct a public restroom facility in Government Camp, along with transit stop improvements and signage, and to complete site identification, permitting and other costs associated with locating a park and ride near Highway 26 between Sandy and Rhododendron. These projects will support the planned development of a Mt Hood Transit Hub, as well as address community concerns regarding the proposed relocation of the rest stop to facilitate the completion of the Summit Redevelopment plans.

RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends approval to apply for this grant and further recommend the acceptance of the award if funded, and that Tootie Smith, Chair, be authorized to sign all documents necessary to accomplish this action on behalf of the Board of Commissioners.

1. How does the grant/funding opportunity support the Department and/or Division's Mission/Purpose/Goals?
These funds are dedicated to enhancing infrastructure for transportation services that are crucial to the well-being of seniors, people with disabilities, rural residents, and other vulnerable populations in Clackamas County. For many of these individuals, these services represent their only reliable means of transportation, ensuring access to essential resources, healthcare, and community engagement. These transit improvements support improved access to essential transit services. This project also supports the approved CDS package submitted by Clackamas County to address next steps in the implementation of the Rest Stop relocation project, which has been identified on a state and federal level as a high priority project.
2. Who, if any, are the community partners who might be better suited to perform this work?
None
3. What are the objectives of this funding opportunity? How will we meet these objectives?
Projects eligible to receive grant funding under the STIF Discretionary and Intercommunity Discretionary Funds include, but are not limited to capital, operations, technology, planning and research activities, including bicycle and pedestrian projects that facilitate greater access to transit services.
Our project will fall under "captial activities" and will provide new capital investments.
4. Does the grant/financial assistance fund an existing program? If yes, which program? If no, what is the purpose of the program?
No but this project will impact access to the Mt Hood Express Operations project. The Mt Hood Express provides affordable public transit services between Sandy along the
Highway 26 corridor to Government Camp, and then up to Timberline Lodge. This is an essential service to provide rural residents with access to employment and other essential
services, as well as providing visitors a safe and accessible option to enjoy Mt Hood.

Additionally, all recipients are required to submit an annual report containing the following: low-income impact mitigation report, Qualified Entity's adopted annual budget for the upcoming fiscal year, and results of any relevant financial audits of the Qualified Entity or any sub-recipient.

Performance evaluation will be based on the completion of the project and spending of Federal dollars to relocated the Restroom and help re-design government camp.

No less than every quarter the county must submit a full, itemized reimbursement request and a cost report. Upon completion the county must submit an itemized project cost report and request for final payment including holdback. The County is responsible to maintain all fiscal records and other records necessary to document County performance for a period of no less than three years.
