Significant Features

A stately and beautiful specimen.

This Douglas Fir tree is a native species of the Pacific Northwest.

A typical Douglas Fir can reach 200 to 250 feet and have a trunk diameter from 4 feet 9 inches to 6 feet 6 inches.

This Douglas Fir provides a home to the local red-tailed hawks and their fledglings. The site is also certified as a wildlife habitat site by the National Wildlife Federation.

The site is located in the Lake Grove area which was logged in the past to heat the Oregon Iron Company foundry that closed in 1894.

This tree is nominated and approved under the Heritage Tree category of specimen.
