ODOT response to C4's December letter to Oregon Transportation Commissioner re Use of IIJA Funds (Discussion)	ODOT replied to the December C4 letter, which requested the OTC consider use of new federal funding to diversify the finance plan for the I-205 bottleneck project in order to keep the first phase of the project on track while delaying the need to toll the project ahead of the rest of the region. The ODOT letter did not acknowledge the policy request by C4 to the OTC and reinforced common technical refrains about I-205 needing to be tolled. C4 discussed their disappointment in ODOT's reply, and directed staff to draft a second letter to the OTC that reinforced the message of the December letter and clarify points out the request that have been miscommunicated.
C4 Agenda Topic Priorities	Tabled to future meeting.
Legislative Update	Chris Lyons, County Government Affairs Manager, outlined

the expectations for the 2022 state legislative session and covered the recently approved Clackamas County state legislative agenda.

Top county priorities include solidifying the state match funding for the county courthouse replacement project and continuing advocating for funding for I-205. Other priorities include support of efforts to address the housing crisis and improve housing stabilities and efforts to provide state indemnification of local governments.
