Match requirement is 25% of the awarded amount, for a maximum amount of \$1,723,298.50. County match obligation is funded by Supportive Housing Services and \$142,763 in budgeted County General Funds.
- 2. Approval of an Amendment to the Revenue Intergovernmental Agreement with the Oregon Health Authority to fund Public Health Services. Amendment Value is \$612,356.27 for 1 year. Total Agreement Value is increased to

\$12,097,806.27 for 2 years. Funding is through the Oregon Health Authority. No County General Funds are involved.

3. Approval of a Purchase and Sale Intergovernmental Agreement with the North Clackamas Parks and Recreation District for the purchase of the property at 15301 SE 92nd Avenue, Clackamas. Purchase price is \$3,500,000. Funding is through Supportive Housing Services, Community Mental Health Program and American Rescue Plan Act funds. No County General Funds are involved.
