WHAT ACTION ARE YOU REQUESTING FROM THE BOARD?

Discussion of proposed Board Order pertaining to Covid and protections for local businesses.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

This idea was first discussed during January 19, 2021 Issues meeting, where the BCC reviewed a Board Order that Yamhill County had approved, and decided to discuss the idea. Staff was directed to create a draft for Clackamas County for the Board to consider. A form of Order essentially mirroring what was passed in Yamhill County is attached. The purpose of that Order was to afford an uncertain level of protection to businesses located within the county that decided to deviate from the restrictions included in the Governor's orders and those of the Oregon Health Authority. Both Josephine and Yamhill counties have passed similar Orders.

WHEREAS, to date an estimated _____ Oregonians have died of or with COVID-19, approximately ____% of those who tested positive, and approximately ____% of Oregon's total population; and

WHEREAS, the principal goal of the original COVID-19 lockdown was to ensure access to appropriate medical treatment when it was required; and

WHEREAS, appropriate modes of medical response and treatment have remained available for the duration of time that the COVID-19 has been present within Clackamas County and will likely continue to be available going forward; and

WHEREAS, like cold and flu viruses, the COVID-19 will probably exist within the human population for an indefinite amount of time; and

WHEREAS, reasonable doubt exists and it cannot be ascertained with certainty that (i) testing by the Oregon Health Authority is accurate since PCR tests are not designed to be used as diagnostics; and (ii) the COVID-19 specific death tolls are accurate, as reported; and

WHEREAS, reasonable concern exists in making future public policy using inaccurate testing, or inaccurate testing numbers; and

WHEREAS, economic security is a pressing issue in Clackamas County and current state lockdown policies continue to have direct negative economic, behavioral health and social consequences;

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED That the Clackamas County Board of County Commissioners Orders as follows:

- Clackamas County formally requests that the Oregon Health Authority disclose PCR cycle thresholds, identify which tests are being used and be fully transparent in all instances of false negative and positive tests to date; and
- 2. Clackamas County will endeavor to work with the Oregon Health Authority and Governor of Oregon to determine, by county, what should be the appropriate risk vs. benefit threshold for future business closures and lockdowns; and
- 3. This Board Order constitutes *prima facia* evidence that persons and entities, including medical providers, within Clackamas County are not subject to findings of negligence-per-se on the sole basis of having engaged in activities that are inconsistent with executive orders related to the COVID-19; and
- 4. This Board Order constitutes *prima facia* evidence that in Clackamas County the hazard posed by the COVID-19 is one of low probability and risk, and that reasonable precautions taken by persons and entities to minimize the virus's spread constitute good faith efforts regardless of whether such precautions are consistent with executive orders related to the COVID-19; and
- 5. All persons and entities within Clackamas County may present this Board Order to any court or tribunal, including proceedings before administrative bodies, as *prima facia* evidence of good faith compliance with relevant state and local laws and rules, including administrative rules, while engaging in activities that are inconsistent with executive orders related to the COVID-19; and
- Reasonable precautions, when adequately communicated and effectively enforced, serve to adequately prevent or minimize employee exposure, including accidental exposure, to COVID-19 regardless of whether such precautions are consistent with executive orders related to the COVID-19; and

7. This Board Order shall have no legal effect unless and until it is validated by a Circuit Court and the Board hereby authorizes County Counsel to apply to Circuit Court for such validation pursuant to applicable law.
