The Department of Transportation and Development (DTD) received a Regional Travel Options (RTO) grant from Metro in 2019 to conduct Safe Routes to School (SRTS) planning and programming for three years. The awarded grant funds allowed the county to sustain the SRTS program and hire a part-time (20 hours per week) SRTS Coordinator on a contract basis. The three-year SRTS Coordinator position is housed within DTD but not a county employee. Due to the COVID-19 global pandemic and subsequent school closures, much of the scope of work for the project could not be completed. Metro has, therefore, granted an additional year and \$39,600.00 of additional monies to Clackamas County under the RTO grant. These changes require an amendment to the original grant contract. The amendment would extend the SRTS program to July 31, 2023.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff respectfully requests that the Board of County Commissioners sign the attached Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with Metro for the Regional Travel Options Grant for Safe Routes to School Program Coordinator for one additional year until July 31, 2023 and \$39,600.00 of additional monies.

AMENDMENT NO. 1

CONTRACT NO. 936220

This Amendment hereby amends the above titled contract between Metro, a metropolitan service district organized under the law of the State of Oregon and the Metro Charter, and **Clackamas County**, hereinafter referred to as "Grantee."

This amendment is a change order to the original scope of work as follows:

Provides additional federal FTA grant funding for fiscal year 2022-2023 of **THIRTY-NINE THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED DOLLARS AND NO/100TH** (\$39,600.00) for the Safe Routes to School Grant. Grantee will contribute an additional non federal local match of **FOUR THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE AND NO/100TH DOLLARS** (\$4,533.00).

B. Effective Date and Duration

The beginning date of this Agreement is July 1, 2019, and shall remain in effect until and including July 31, 2023, unless terminated or extended as provided in this Agreement. Costs incurred on or after July 1, 2019, which are deemed allowable costs for this project, will be reimbursed once all parties have signed this Agreement and Metro has been presented with the appropriate invoice and documentation.

D. Compensation

The total Agreement amount is **ONE HUNDRED SEVENTY-SEVEN THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED SIXTY-EIGHT AND NO/100**th's **DOLLARS (\$177,868.00)**. This amount includes (1) FTA GRANT funds to be dispersed to Grantee not to exceed **ONE HUNDRED FIFTY-NINE THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED AND NO/100**th's **DOLLARS (\$159,600.00)**; (2) Grantee's non federal local match of **EIGHTEEN THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED SIXTY-EIGHT AND NO/100**th's **DOLLARS (\$18,268.00)**.

CLACKAMAS COUNTY SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL - SCOPE OF WORK (SOW)

This project will coordinate Safe Routes to School (SRTS) activities and programming at Clackamas County schools within the Metro Service Boundary. A part-time Safe Routes to School Coordinator will be contracted to conduct outreach and coordinate SRTS programming. County staff from the Department of Transportation and Development (DTD); Health, Housing and Human Services (H3S) and Public and Government (PGA) will provide support to implement and complete the scope of work.

Project Goals

Clackamas County's vision for Safe Routes to School (SRTS) is to create a sustainable program available to all community members and to make bicycling and walking to school a feasible form of transportation, thereby encouraging a healthy and active lifestyle at an early age. The program includes 6 goals to realize this vision.

- 1. Build awareness of Safe Routes to School and promote active transportation options through encouragement activities in at least 10 schools in Clackamas County.
- 2. Expand bicycle and pedestrian safety education at Clackamas County schools.
- 3. Work with community and law enforcement partners to improve road user behavior around schools by obeying traffic safety laws and sharing the road safely.
- 4. Work with partners to establish a list of priority infrastructure and operational improvements for at least one Title One school each year.
- 5. Regularly collect, analyze and share data by conducting tallies and surveys to evaluate program performance.
- 6. Ensure the Clackamas County SRTS program prioritizes activity and investment in areas with a high percentage of communities of color and low-income residents.

Evaluation Plan

The Clackamas County Safe Routes to School Project will involve collecting data from schools at least once a year via the classroom tally sheets available from the National SRTS database. As detailed in the below scope of work Clackamas SRTS Program plans to build on existing evaluation methods to gather additional feedback from students, teachers, school administrators, and parents.

Clackamas SRTS will collect data to address the environment, equity and health, economy, efficiency and engagement elements of Metro's Multiple Account Evaluation Framework. Data will be reported to Metro quarterly and combined into a Final Report that tracks progress toward goals and summarizes the schools and students involved in encouragement events and bike/ped safety education, as well as progress on school Action Plans.

Project Area

The project area includes school districts and schools within the urban area of Clackamas County. Within the Metro Service Boundary there are six school districts: Gladstone, Lake Oswego, North Clackamas School District, Oregon City, Oregon Trail and West Linn-Wilsonville.
