EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: Metro administers the 2040 Planning and Development Grant program, which provides funding for a variety planning projects in the Metro region. This project is an information gathering exercise that will help us understand development challenges in future urban areas (urban reserves and rurally zoned areas in the Portland Metropolitan Urban Growth Boundary). Informed by the Industrial Site Readiness Study, the Development Ready Land Study will gather information about land readiness within future growth areas. This study would require strong city partnerships and would yield the following five outcomes.

- 1. Alignment and Partnership with city partners and impacted service providers.
- 2. Understanding of Available Usable Lands for both future housing and job growth.
- 3. Public/Private Partnerships to support development.
- 4. Information that will inform regional and state land use advocacy approaches.
- 5. A high level understanding of the real cost of Infrastructure Investments necessary to make land shovel ready.

The mission of the Department of Transportation and Development is to provide transportation maintenance and construction, neighborhood enhancement, land use, planning, permitting and dog services to residents, property owners, businesses and the traveling public so they and future generations can experience and invest in a healthy, safe and livable community.

This proposal addresses livability and investment in a healthy, safe and livable community by creating a clearer understanding of the challenges to developing land in the urban reserves as well as the rural land within the UGB.

This project fall under the "Grants for Planning Inside the UGB". The primary objectives of this category are to produce planning work that helps facilitate development and redevelopment, supports economic growth and stability, engages communities, and implements Metro's goals for livable and equitable communities as outlined in the 2040 Growth Concept.

The proposed project aligns directly with the objectives of supporting economic growh antd stability as well as facilitating development and redevelopment.

20% of the award can be used to fund existing staff to manage and participate in the project.

Yes. We will use existing Department of Transportation and Development staff to manage and participate in the grant study. It is expected that a consultant team will be used to complete the project in conjunction with a project management team.

Staff is coordinating with jurisdictional partners that are adjacent to Urban Reserves, including Lake Oswego, West Linn, Happy Valley, Wilsonville and Oregon City.

Lake Oswego has submitted a letter stating that they do not want the Stafford area included in the study.

3. If this is a pilot project, what is the plan for sun setting the project and/or staff if it does not continue (e.g. making staff positions temporary or limited duration, etc.)?

This project is not a pilot project. This is a study to understand the challenges of developing the land currently designated as Urban Reserves or rurally zoned land in the UGB.
