Amendment value is \$20,455 for 1 year, agreement value is increased to \$204,803 for 2 years. **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**: The Social Services Division of the Health, Housing and Human Services requests approval of Amendment #3 to the Subrecipient Agreement with the Hoodland Senior Center to provide Older American Act (OAA) funded services for persons living in the Hoodland area. The services include home-delivered meals, evidence-based health promotion activities, transportation, and information and referral activities. These services link residents with resources to meet their individual needs. This helps seniors to remain independent and active in the community.

Amendment #3 provides budget adjustments for the ongoing delivery of services for the fiscal year 2022-23. The purpose of the Hoodland Senior Center (HSC) is to serve the needs of anyone 60 or older. The HSC service area is the greater Hoodland area, defined as the area between

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Alder Creek and Government Camp, including the Welches, Rhododendron, Brightwood, and Zigzag villages.

It is the goal of HSC to develop and maintain an active senior citizen program in the Hoodland area that provides opportunities and creates an atmosphere that encourages older adults to use their skills, develop their potential, and continue their involvement in the community. Hoodland Senior Center also intends to promote independent living for senior adults, allowing them to continue to live in their homes with dignity and safety. Each week the Hoodland Senior Center provides meals to more than 30 individuals in the Hoodland area and supports seniors with information and assistance, health promotion activities, and critical transportation services.

**RECOMMENDATION:** Staff recommends the Board approve this Subrecipient Agreement Amendment and authorization for the Chair to sign on behalf of the County.

#### **Justification for Amendment:**

Amendment #3 to Subrecipient Agreement 22-003 ("Agreement") with Hoodland Senior Center provides budget adjustments for ongoing delivery of services for fiscal year 2022-23 and results in an increase to the budget by an additional \$20,455, for a total Agreement amount of \$204,803. (24425)

This Amendment #3 is effective upon signature and continues through June 30, 2023.

Except as amended hereby, all other terms and conditions of the contract remain in full force and effect. COUNTY has identified the changes with **"bold/italic"** font for easy reference.

### AMEND Section 4, Grant Funds:

4. Grant Funds. COUNTY's funding for this Agreement is a combination of Federal, State and Local dollars as specified below by title and Catalog of Federal Regulations ("CFDA") number as appropriate. The maximum, not to exceed, grant amount that COUNTY will pay is \$184,348. This is a cost reimbursement grant and disbursements will be made in accordance with the requirements contained in Exhibit 5 – Reporting Requirements and Exhibit 6 – Budget and Units of Services.

a. **Grant Funds:** COUNTY's funding of \$90,535 in grant funds for this Agreement is the Older Americans Act (CFDA: 93.043, 93.044, 93.052, 93.053) issued to COUNTY by the State of Oregon, Department of Human Services ("ODHS"), Adults and People with Disabilities (APD), Community Services & Solutions Unit (CSSU) and \$5,400 from Federal Transportation Administration funds (Federal Statute: 49 USC 5310; CFDA: 20.513) issued to COUNTY by Ride Connection, Inc., an Oregon nonprofit corporation.

**b. Other Funds**. COUNTY's funding of \$85,913 for transportation services outlined in this agreement are from Elderly and Disabled Transportation funds issued to COUNTY by Ride Connection, Inc. and TriMet. COUNTY's funding of \$2,500 for Low Income Home Energy Assistance application assistance outlined in this Agreement are from HEAT Oregon, an Oregon nonprofit organization.

Other Funds.** COUNTY's funding of \$85,913 for transportation services outlined in this agreement are from Elderly and Disabled Transportation funds issued to COUNTY by Ride Connection, Inc. and TriMet. COUNTY's funding of **\$3,750** for Low Income Home Energy Assistance application assistance outlined in this Agreement are from HEAT Oregon, an Oregon nonprofit organization.
