Low levels of housing development of all types during the recession combined with population increases have resulted in extremely low vacancy rates, skyrocketing rents (increase recognized by HUD with a 28% increase in FMRs), and long wait lists for affordable housing. Many people who were unstably housed have moved into unsheltered situations.

Coordinated Entry call-in line staff interviewed all callers for the PIT this year. While we had an operating Coordinated Entry program during the 2015 PIT count, it had only been in place for a few weeks. Therefore, we took more calls and completed more surveys through that source than in our last PIT count.

Since our last count, we have added a veterans outreach worker at the County level. That outreach worker created partnerships with other outreach workers in our community, who were not otherwise in communication. These folks were able to coordinate their knowledge of homeless camp locations, and use their relationships with the unsheltered community to effectively target and survey this population.
