Under state law, the city commission may refer to the voters of Oregon City an ordinance imposing a tax or fee on the sale of recreational marijuana items in the city by a licensed marijuana retailer. Approval of this measure would impose a three percent tax on the sale of marijuana items in the city by a licensed marijuana retailer. The tax would be collected at the point of sale and remitted by the marijuana retailer.  Under state law, a city that adopts an ordinance that prohibits the establishment of marijuana businesses in that city may not impose a tax or fee on the production, processing or sale of marijuana or any product into which marijuana has been incorporated. This measure would become operative only if the measure proposing to prohibit the establishment of any of those marijuana entities does not pass by a majority of votes.

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## Measure Explanatory Statement for County Voters' Pamphlet

Approval of this measure would impose a three percent tax on the sale of marijuana items by a marijuana retailer within the city of Oregon City. There are no restrictions on how the city may use the revenues generated by this tax. However, the city has also referred a measure banning all marijuana businesses within the city; this measure will become operative only if that ballot measure fails.

Under Measure 91, adopted by Oregon voters in November 2014, codified in ORS chapter 475B and amended by the Legislature in 2016, the Oregon Liquor Control Commission must license the retail sale of recreational marijuana. ORS 475B.345 provides that a city council may adopt an ordinance imposing up to a three percent tax on the sale of marijuana items (which include marijuana concentrates, extracts, edibles, and other products intended for human consumption and use) by retail licensees in the city, but the council must refer that ordinance to the voters at a statewide general election.

The Oregon City Commission has adopted an ordinance imposing a three percent tax on the sale of marijuana items by a retail licensee in the city, and, as a result, has referred this measure to the voters. However, this measure will become operative only if the ballot measure prohibiting the establishment of marijuana businesses fails.

Under state law, a city that adopts an ordinance that prohibits the establishment of marijuana businesses in the city may not impose a tax or fee on the sale of marijuana items. As a result, if the voters pass the measure prohibiting marijuana businesses in Oregon City, this tax measure will not become operative, even if it also receives a majority of votes.
