CALL TO ORDER

Chair Smith recessed the Board of County Commissioners and convened the Housing Authority of Clackamas County Board of Commissioners. Resident commissioner Ann Leenstra joined the meeting.

I. HOUSING AUTHORITY CONSENT AGENDA

A. Approval of a Resolution to Appoint Resident Commissioner Ann Leenstra to a new 4year term. No fiscal impact. No County General Funds are involved.

Clerk to the Board Tony Mayernik read the consent agenda. Chair Smith asked if any Commissioner wished to remove any item from the consent agenda. No request were heard.

Commissioner Leenstra: "I move we approve the consent agenda for the Housing Authority." Commissioner Shull seconded the motion. No further discussion was heard.

II. SERVICE DISTRICT #5 (STREET LIGHTING) PUBLIC HEARINGS

A. Approval of a Board Order Forming New Assessment Areas within Clackamas County Service District No. 5. Current Value from the addition of 15 assessment areas is estimated at \$9,577.60 annually. Funding through rate payers. No County General Funds are involved.

Transportation & Development Director Dan Johnson and Service District Specialist Wendi Coryell briefed the Board on the proposed assessment areas and indicated that no remonstrances have been received.

Commissioner Shull thanked staff for their work on this service district and the continued efforts to manage ratepayer assessments. Commissioner Savas asked about potential increases in light of recent PGE rate increases, staff indicated that the assessments are regularly reviewed as part of the budgeting process, and any changes would be addressed at that time.

Approval of a Resolution Declaring the Public Necessity and purpose for Acquisition of Right of Way and Easements and Authorizing Good Faith Negotiations and Condemnation Actions for the Henry Creek (Arlie Mitchell Road) Culvert Replacement Project. Total Project Value is \$1,018,460. Project funding is through the City of Portland, Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, U.S. Forest Service, Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board, and \$99,756 in County Road Funds. No County General Funds are involved.

- 5. Approval of a Revenue Agreement with CareOregon for Dental Program Payment Incentives. Anticipated agreement value is \$300,000 for 1 year. Funding is through CareOregon. No County General Funds are involved.
- 6. Approval to Apply for a Continuation Grant for AmeriCorps Senior Companion Program Funds. The anticipated value is \$139,025 for 1 year. Funding is through the AmeriCorps Senior Companion Program, with \$13,902 in matching funds from Statewide Transportation Improvement Funds. No County General Funds are involved.
