"On August 6, 2014, County Administrator Don Krupp announced the implementation of a process to establish County "Core Values" as a way to illustrate the principles that will guide County employees in their work with each other and the people Clackamas County services.

Utilizing a collaborative process between Public and Government Affairs, County Administration, the Clackamas County Leadership Academy, Department Directors, and County employees, approximately three dozen words were selected and ranked by importance as derived from an all-County survey. They were then arranged into their current acronym—SPIRIT (Service, Professionalism, Integrity, Respect, Individual Accountability and Trust), which will be used in conjunction with implementation and administration of Performance Clackamas, the County's Strategic Planning process that will define, guide, and support the work the County will do every day."
