Dear Chair Smith:

I am excited to announce the creation of 82nd Avenue Transit Project Steering Committee by Metro Council on June 2nd. The committee will lead a public process to identify a transit concept for 82nd Avenue in Portland and Clackamas County. Developing a bus project that improves reliability, travel times, and safe access to transit on the 82nd Avenue corridor is essential to achieve our region's 2040 Growth Concept, Climate Smart Strategy, racial equity goals and shared priorities for the many people who travel this busy corridor. TriMet's line 72 on 82nd Avenue is the highest ridership bus line in TriMet's entire system carrying more riders than two light rail lines while providing crucial connections to jobs, shopping, and services. However, this route is regularly stuck in traffic. The 82nd Avenue transit project provides the opportunity to transform transit to better serve our diverse communities.

Clackamas County is a critical partner in this effort. In recognition, we make the following request to appoint a representative from your Board to serve on a Steering Committee for this 82nd Avenue project. Collaboration between the City of Portland, Clackamas County, Multnomah County, the Port of Portland, ODOT, TriMet and Metro is foundational to improving transit on 82nd Avenue. The Steering Committee will ensure your interests are incorporated into the project. The committee will also include up to four community members who are working simultaneously on an Equitable Development Strategy to identify and further community priorities separate but related to the transit project in this very diverse corridor. A description of the committee and its charge is attached. We anticipate monthly meetings starting in summer 2022 as needed, with a goal of completing the Steering Committee's work in the second half of 2023. The Committee is expected to be active for a period of approximately 18 months. The two of us will co-chair the committee and we are thrilled to begin this work together.
