Approval of Grant Amendment #1 to Federal Subrecipient Agreement with City of Sandy, on behalf of its Sandy Senior & Community Center for the provision of services to Clackamas County residents. Total Amendment Value is \$12,000. Funding source is the federal Older Americans Act.  
County General Funds are not involved.

<b>Purpose/Outcomes</b>	Approval of Amendment #1 to adjust budget of Subrecipient Agreement to meet increased demand and provide additional operational support.

**BACKGROUND:**

The Social Services Division of the Health, Housing and Human Services request approval of Amendment #1 to the Subrecipient Agreement with the City of Sandy, on behalf of its Sandy Senior & Community Center to provide Older American Act (OAA) funded services for persons living in the Sandy area. The services include congregate and home delivered meals, evidence-based health promotion activities, transportation, and information and referral activities. These services link residents with resources to meet their individual needs. This helps them to remain independent and active in the community.

Amendment #1 to Subrecipient Agreement 22-011 provides budget adjustments to Titles IIIB, III-C, and NSIP of Older American Acts funding to align with the current State of Oregon Department of Human Services, Community Services & Supports Unit Allocation and provides additional operational support to address additional needs due to COVID pandemic impacts. This Amendment #1 rebalances projected units of service and meals served to be closer to anticipated actuals.

*Healthy Families. Strong Communities.*

This agreement is effective July 1, 2021 and terminates on June 30, 2022. This amendment has been approved by County Council on June 2, 2022.

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**Justification for Amendment:**

Amendment #1 to Subrecipient Agreement 22-011 ("Agreement") with City of Sandy, on behalf of its Sandy Senior & Community Center provides budget adjustments to Titles IIIB, III-C, and NSIP of Older American Acts funding to align with the current State of Oregon Department of Human Services, Community Services & Supports Unit Allocation and provides additional operational support to address additional needs due to COVID pandemic impacts. This Amendment #1 rebalances projected units of service and meals served to be closer to anticipated actuals. This results in an increase to the contract budget of \$12,000.

This Amendment #1 is effective upon signature and continues through June 30, 2022.

Except as amended hereby, all other terms and conditions of the contract remain in full force and effect. COUNTY has identified the changes with "***bold/italic***" font for easy reference.

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**AMEND the following portion of Section 4, Grant Funds:**

**4. Grant Funds.** COUNTY's funding for this Agreement is a combination of Federal, State and Local dollars as specified below by title and Catalog of Federal Regulations ("CFDA") number as appropriate. The maximum, not to exceed, grant amount that COUNTY will pay is \$194,706. This is a cost reimbursement grant and disbursements will be made in accordance with the requirements contained in Exhibit 5 – Reporting Requirements and Exhibit 6 – Budget and Units of Services.

**a. Grant Funds:** COUNTY's funding of \$70,874 in grant funds for this Agreement is the Older Americans Act (CFDA: 93.043, 93.044, 93.052, 93.053) issued to COUNTY by the State of Oregon, Department of Human Services ("ODHS"), Adults and People with Disabilities (APD), Community Services & Solutions Unit (CSSU) and \$34,800 from Federal Transportation Administration funds (Federal Statute: 49 USC 5310; CFDA: 20.513) issued to COUNTY by Ride Connection, Inc., an Oregon nonprofit corporation.
