Caption: Borrowing for Oregon City Urban Renewal Agency

Question: Shall the Urban Renewal Agency be approved to borrow up to \$44 million for projects in the Urban Renewal Plan?

Summary: Approval of this measure would not authorize an additional tax.

The Downtown Oregon City/North End Urban Renewal Plan includes projects to improve livability, increase tourism and recreation opportunities, provide for infrastructure investment on blighted properties and create jobs in Oregon City. The Agency has identified three priority projects in the Plan, the Rossman Landfill cleanup and redevelopment, development and mitigation projects at Clackamette Cove, and redevelopment of the Stimson Property on Washington Street. Other projects identified in the Plan include redevelopment of the County Courthouse, improvements at the End of the Oregon Trail Interpretive Center, creation of a downtown railroad Quiet Zone, and new development on the publicly owned 12th and Main Street property.

This measure would provide approval for the Agency to borrow up to \$44 million for projects identified in the Plan. The borrowings would be repaid by tax increment revenues collected within Oregon City.

The borrowings may be issued in one or more series, each maturing within 20 years of issuance, and the Agency may refinance the borrowings.

Caption: Renew Portland Children's Levy investment for five years.

Question: Shall Portland continue early childhood, child abuse and mentoring programs; five-year levy \$0.4026 per \$1,000 assessed value beginning 2024? ·

This measure renews current local option taxes.

Summary: Renews the Portland Children's Levy investment at current rate; supports proven programs preventing childhood hunger, child abuse and neglect, helping children arrive at school ready to learn, providing safe constructive after-school alternatives for kids, and helping foster children and youth succeed.

Funds can only be used for:

**Preventing childhood hunger:** giving hungry children healthy food.

**Child abuse prevention and intervention:** addressing juvenile crime, school failure, drug and alcohol abuse, homeless youth.

**Early childhood programs:** making childcare more affordable and preparing children for success in school.

**After school, summer and mentoring programs:** promoting academic achievement, reducing the number of youth victimized by crime, increasing graduation rates, mentoring programs supporting transition to college and career for youth.

**Foster care programs:** helping foster children and youth succeed.

Accountability measures include:

- Investments subject to annual audits.
- Programs funded must be cost effective and have a proven record of success.
- Investments subject to oversight by a citizen committee.
- Administrative costs cannot exceed 5%.

The levy will raise approximately \$24,944,885 in 2024-2025, \$25,778,359 in 2025-2026, \$26,603,267 in 2026-2027, \$27,454,571 in 2027-2028, and \$28,333,118 in 2028-2029, for a total of \$133,114,201.

Colton School

Measure No: 3-593

Caption: Bonds to renovate District facilities and improve safety and security.

Question: Shall District issue \$8,000,000 in bonds to renovate schools and improve safety and security at school facilities? If the bonds are approved, they will be payable from taxes on property or property ownership that are not subject to the limits of sections 11 and 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Summary: Colton School District has been awarded \$4,000,000 State grant which will be available only if the bonds are approved. If the bonds are not approved, the grant could go to another district.

Bond and grant funds to finance:

- Construction of a new Career and Technical Education shop facility
- Classroom Heating, cooling & ventilation improvements and LED lighting upgrades
- Exterior repairs to existing school buildings such as new siding, windows and entries
- Remodeling of core classrooms to accommodate expanded curriculums
- Repurposing common spaces to provide student social interaction areas
- School safety, security and ADA upgrades
- Improvements to school district grounds, sports fields and infrastructure
- New interior finishes such as carpet and paint
- Paying costs of the Project including costs of issuance of bonds

District would establish a citizen oversight committee to ensure proceeds are used for purposes indicated.

Bonds would mature within 20 years from issuance. Estimated increase over FY 2023 bond tax rate is \$0.78 per \$1,000 assessed property value. Actual levy rate may differ due to changes in interest rates and assessed value.

Caption: Local option levy renewal to maintain teaching positions, classroom programs

Question: Shall District preserve class sizes, programs, educators; levy \$1.64 per \$1,000 assessed value for operations for five years beginning 2024-2025. This measure renews current local option taxes.

Summary: Lake Oswego School District's current local option levy was approved by voters in 2019. The operating levy funds one-third of all teaching positions in the District. Levy has been approved by Lake Oswego School District voters since first introduced in 2000.  
This measure renews the levy at its current rate and would not increase property tax rates.

Levy resources would preserve and continue to fund:

- Educator positions to preserve class sizes and unblended grade levels
- Instructional time to keep the current number of school days
- Elective programming such as music, art, engineering, and technology
- Mental health supports for students' well being

Funds subject to accountability measures, including annual audits and School Board oversight.

If approved, this measure would continue the current local option levy of \$1.64 per \$1,000 of assessed value and is estimated to raise approximately \$16,000,000 in 2024-2025, \$16,500,000 in 2025-2026, \$17,000,000 in 2026-2027, \$17,500,000 in 2027-2028, and \$18,000,000 in 2028-29, for a total of \$85,000,000 over five years.

Caption: 5 Year Local Option Levy to Maintain Teachers, Class Sizes

Question: Shall District maintain teachers, class sizes, academics, extracurricular programs; levy \$1.50 per \$1000 assessed value for five years beginning 2023-24? This measure may cause property taxes to increase more than three percent.

Summary: Sherwood schools are facing an anticipated \$7 million funding shortfall for the 2023/24 school year due to rapidly increased costs due to inflation, inadequate funding from the State of Oregon and lack of district reserves to offset or mitigate reductions.

These reductions may include:

- 30 teachers
- 19 classified staff
- 10 furlough days
- Loss of academic programming

If approved Levy would provide School District with an estimated \$6.5 million annually in funding to help maintain:

- Teaching positions
- Small class sizes
- Electives and co-curricular activities including engineering, robotics, agriculture, dual language, physical education
- Career-Technical and Advanced Placement courses
- School safety measures

Funds will be placed in a sub-account, and a citizen budget committee and school board oversight will monitor expenditures to verify that funds are used as approved by voters. No levy funds will be spent for administration. Performance auditing of school district programs also will be done.

Caption: Five-year levy for hiring additional firefighters & general operations.

Question: Shall AFD replace current rate with \$1.98/assessed value for five years beginning 2023, hiring EMTs/Firefighters and enhancing operations? This measure may cause property taxes to increase more than three percent.

Summary: Aurora Fire is seeking a five-year local option tax for general operations. Monies are needed to maintain and hire additional career EMTs/Firefighters. This levy will assist the District to staff apparatus with up to 3 career EMTs/Firefighters 24/7. The District currently has funding for two firefighters per 24 hours, this is below national standards of staffing of a three person minimum crew.

AFD responds to over 1300 emergencies a year, the amount of calls is stretching current resources thin. The reality is that times have changed. Demands on volunteers have become increasingly difficult to balance. We are no longer the small rural district we used to be, we are asking you to decide what service level you want us to provide. Money will be used for staffing, general operating expenses such as equipment, supplies and repairs. This levy request will help ensure we are staffed for your emergency and will put us on target for meeting minimum staffing standards. This levy replaces the current rate of \$0.99.

The proposed rate will raise approximately \$2,208,296 in 2023-24; \$2,284,485 in 2024-25; \$2,353,351 in 2025-26; \$2,423,992 in 2026-27; and 2,496,712 in 2027-28.

Caption: Replacement Local Option Levy for Fire and Emergency Medical Services

Question: Shall Canby Fire District maintain emergency response services by levying \$0.95 per \$1,000 assessed value for five years, beginning 2023? This measure may cause property taxes to increase by more than three percent.

Summary: The Canby Fire District replacement levy would fund a total of 12 firefighter/medics, an increase of 6 firefighter/medics over what the District's existing levy funds.

Since voters first approved the existing levy rate 8 years ago, emergency calls have risen 56%, exceeding 3,500 in 2022. Currently, 47% of the time a Canby Fire crew responds to a medical emergency, a second crew is called to another emergency.

When a third call occurs while two crews are already responding, response delays are likely because first responders in neighboring districts may be called out to assist. If the levy passes, Canby Fire would be able to maintain three medical/fire emergency response teams 24/7.

The levy rate would be \$0.95 per \$1,000 assessed value, an increase of \$0.50 per \$1,000 over the current levy. For a home with the District-average assessed (not market) value of \$276,000, the cost would be \$262 per year or \$22 a month. If the levy passes, Canby Fire would stop collecting on the existing levy and start collecting on the replacement levy.

The estimated amounts to be raised annually by this levy are: FY2023-2024: \$2,836,634 FY2024-2025: \$2,921,733 FY2025-2026: 3,009,385 FY2026-2027: 3,099,667 FY2027-2028: 3,192,657

Question: Shall LGFD maintain fire and emergency services by levying \$.15 per \$ 1,000 of AV for five years, beginning 2024-25?

Summary: This measure would authorize the Lake Grove Rural Fire Protection District No. 57 ("District") to renew its local option tax levy for fire services at a rate of \$.15 per \$ 1,000 dollars of assessed value on real property located within the District, beginning FY 2024-25. The District's previous five-year levy for fire services, in the amount of \$.15 per \$ 1,000 of assessed value, expires June 30, 2024.

The Fire District contracts with the City of Lake Oswego for the provision of all fire and emergency operations for District residents. This levy, if approved, will be used to reimburse the City for those services. A small portion of the levy would be retained by the District to pay for District administration such as rent, audit and legal services and election expenses.

Question: Shall MRFPD maintain fire and emergency medical services by levying \$0.76 per \$1,000.00 of AV for five years, beginning 2023-24? This measure renews current local option taxes.

Summary: Molalla Rural Fire Protection District #73 provides fire, emergency medical, and ambulance services to residents of Molalla, Mulino, and surrounding areas. Operations are funded through a property tax base and local option levy.

If adopted, this levy renewal would enable the District to retain paramedic/firefighters funded by the current levy. Levy funds would:

- Help maintain the District's current ability to handle multiple emergency calls at the same time without having to wait for backup from neighboring districts.
- Help ensure a second ambulance crew is available when one crew is already involved in transporting a patient to an area hospital, a trip that can take 2 hours or more.
- Retain 7 paramedic/firefighters with advanced life-saving skills that bring a near emergency-room level of assistance to patients.

The levy would be renewed at the same rate as the current levy: \$0.76 per \$1,000.00 of assessed value.

For a home with an assessed value (not market value) of \$214,000, about average for residential property in the District, the cost would be about \$163 per year.

The requested rate will raise approximately \$1,464,321 in 2023-2024, \$1,515,572 in 2024-2025, \$1,568,617 in 2025-2026, \$1,623,518 in 2026-2027 and \$1,680,342 in 2027-2028.

The estimated tax cost for this measure is an ESTIMATE ONLY based on the best information available from the county assessor at the time of estimate and may reflect the impact of early payment discounts, compression and the collection rate.
