RE: Proposed Gates on Clackamas Road

DATE: June 4, 2024

REQUEST:

Will the BCC hold a public hearing to permit two gates and a "Road Closed" sign to be installed on Clackamas Road between the Union Pacific Railroad (UP) and Minuteman Way?

BACKGROUND:

Clackamas Road is a dead-end County Road between Minuteman Way and the Union Pacific Railroad in the Clackamas Industrial Area. The public road only serves two property owners in addition to the railroad and a small piece of property owned by the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT). Currently, there is a collection of campers and recreational vehicles using the right-of-way obstructing access and resulting in garbage piles, waste, and hazardous debris.

Partnering agencies (Transportation and Development, Clackamas County Sheriff's Office and County Counsel) have been coordinating and in discussions with adjoining property owners on how best to deal with the issue. Options have included, but are not limited to, coordinated clearing of the roadway, vacation of the right-of-way and gating of the roadway.

Per Clackamas County Code 7.03.090.M, gates are prohibited on public roads unless the BCC holds a public hearing and there is approval from 100% of the landowners that access from or adjoin the road right-of-way to be gated.

In this particular case, there is approval of 100% of the landowners to gate the road in question and one of the property owners has offered to construct the gate at each end of the road.

If the BCC holds a hearing and approves the gate, the private property owner will install a gate at each end of the road at their expense, and the County would then work with the Sheriff's Office, Health Housing and Human Services and others to have the right-of-way cleared of campers and RVs. In addition, if the BCC approves a "Road Closed" sign, it will be easier for the County to keep the area clear. Subsequent to that, County Staff would work with the property owners to vacate the public right-of-way in the future.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the BCC direct Staff to schedule a public hearing to permit two gates and a "Road Closed" sign to be installed on Clackamas Road between the Union Pacific Railroad (UP) and Minuteman Way.
