WHAT ACTION ARE YOU REQUESTING FROM THE BOARD?

Staff requests approval of the 2014 Small Grants recommendation.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The Clackamas County Board of Commissioners approved \$200,000 in the 2014/15 FY budget to fund the 2014 Small Grants Program. This is the sixth year of the program. The goal of the program is to support agencies that are making an effort to develop and implement innovative projects that would help most vulnerable families, seniors, and others meet their basic needs such as food assistance and abuse prevention. Preference is given to those who meet the following criteria:

- Prevent occurrence of larger, more dire problems later;
- Save money later through early intervention;
- Serve people throughout the community.

This year we received 88 applications for a total request of \$878,887. This is an increase from 75 applications received last year totaling \$874,539. The total amount requested remained stable due to the \$15,000 limit per grant application. A committee was formed to review the applications as well as past small grant awards and current funding from other county departments to determine the attached recommendations. The committee included Caroline Hill, Small Grants Coordinator; Emily Klepper, Commissioner Policy Coordinator; Diedre Landon, Department of Transportation and Development and Bates Russell, Technology Services.

Information was distributed to committee members in September for review prior to two subsequent meetings on September 15 and October 9. The committee has remained in contact via email to complete the attached recommendation (see attachment 1). Our focus was to ensure that the monies were dispersed as evenly as possible throughout the County (see attachments 3 and 4) and to impact diverse groups. Here are some highlights from this year's requests:

- Clackamas Volunteers in Medicine/The Founders Clinic the Board through the Small Grants program expressed interest during budget deliberations this year to fund their request for malpractice insurance. We recommend fully funding.
- Veterans –Requests for various projects focusing on veterans were received. Folk
 Time Inc. stood out with their application for funds to continue their peer support
 program for Afghanistan and Iraq veterans. Sycamore Lane Therapeutic Riding
 Center rose to the top with their project to offer free mental health counseling and
 therapeutic riding for veterans.
- Food requests We received food requests from multiple agencies (big and small) totaling \$73,278. After careful consideration the committee opted for allocating equal funding amounts per geographic area.
- Innovative projects We received many applications for projects that showed a creative approach to the needs of the County. An example of this is The Culture Club. Their project addresses youth and food needs by engaging Molalla's High School students in the maintenance of a garden as well as managing an after school produce stand that would sell food to the community at a low cost and donate to the Molalla Meals on Wheels program.

Today we are seeking approval of the recommendation (see attachment 1) from the Board so that we can process awards.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS (current year and ongoing):

\$200,000 from general funds is already budgeted in the 2014/15 FY budget.

The 2014 Small Grants Program was opened to the public on July 1, 2014 and remained open until August 15, 2014. During that time:

- A press release to media and interested parties went out inviting organizations to apply.
- An email announcement went out to all past applicants.
- The Board announced the program during several Business Meetings.
- A webpage was created detailing the Small Grants program and included all the necessary information and documents to apply.
- Finally, a testimonial video featuring one of last year's recipients was created by our Cable office and displayed during a Business Meeting, the Small Grants web page and was regularly aired on our cable channel.


