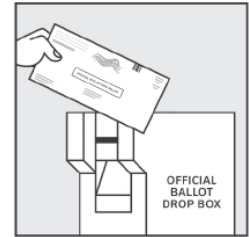
Important Information

Dear Clackamas County Voter:

This Voters' Pamphlet contains information designed to assist you in voting: candidates' statements, ballot titles, explanatory statements, and arguments pertaining to local measures that appear on the May 18, 2021 Special District Election ballot in Clackamas County.

You will not vote on everything that appears in this pamphlet, only those candidate races and measures that appear on the Official Ballot in your Vote-By-Mail packet. In order to vote on a certain measure or race, you must be an active registered voter of the jurisdiction placing the measure on the ballot. If you think something is missing from your ballot, contact our office.

Postage is no longer required to mail in your ballot. Your voted ballot must be received at the Elections Office, 1710 Red Soils Court, Suite 100, in Oregon City or an official ballot drop site by 8:00 p.m. on election night in order to be counted. Remember, the postmark on a mailed ballot does NOT count.

Official ballot drop sites are listed on Page 87 of this pamphlet. All drop sites in Clackamas County are now available to the public 24 hours a day from April 28, 2021 until 8:00 p.m. on Election Day. Please check the list as some locations have changed.

Ballots will be delivered to households between Thursday, April 29th and Monday, May 3rd. Please contact us if you have not received a ballot by Wednesday, May 5th.

If a ballot was delivered to your residence for someone who should no longer be receiving ballots at your address, please write "RETURN" on the envelope and place it back in your mailbox. If a ballot was sent to someone who has passed away, please write "DECEASED" on the envelope and place it back in your mailbox.

We will be conducting the Public Certification Test of our vote tally system on May 11, 2021 at 9:00 a.m. Please contact our office if you would like to observe this process.

If you need assistance voting or have any questions about this particular election or the election process, please call the Elections Division at 503.655.8510.

The printing of candidate statements, measure filings, and arguments does not constitute an endorsement by Clackamas County, nor does the county warrant the accuracy or truth of any statements.

Voting Instructions

1. Vote your Official Ballot

Locate the candidate or measure response (Yes or No) of your choice for each contest. To vote, completely darken the rectangle to the left of your choice with black or blue ink. [Figure 1]

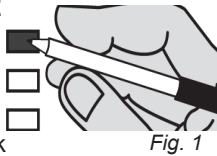

Remember: If you vote for more than the number of candidates allowed for an office, or you vote both Yes and No on a measure, it is called an overvote and your vote for the candidate or measure will not count. [Figure 2]

You are not required to vote on everything. Your ballot will still be counted as cast and your votes for other contests will be counted.

2. Review your Official Ballot

Ensure you have correctly marked your choice for each contest. Your official ballot may contain contests printed on both front and back. Remember to review both sides!

If you lose your ballot, or it is spoiled in any way, contact the Clackamas County Elections Division at **503.655.8510** to request a replacement ballot.

3. Return your Official Ballot

Place your voted Official Ballot in the envelope and sign the Voter's Statement. If you forget your secrecy sleeve, it is not a problem.

Remember: Read and sign the Voter's Statement on the Return Ballot Envelope. Your ballot cannot be counted if the Return Ballot Envelope is not signed.

By Mail: **Postage is no longer required** to mail your Return Ballot Envelope. Please mail it as soon as possible; it must arrive at Clackamas County Elections Division no later than 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 18, 2021. **Remember, the postmark does not count!**

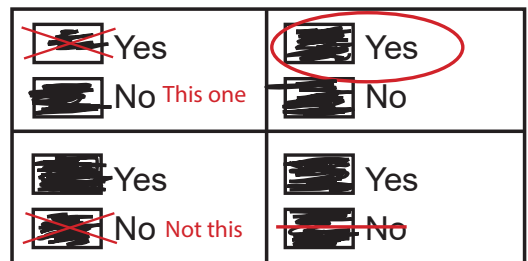

Don't tear up your ballot yet. You can fix it!

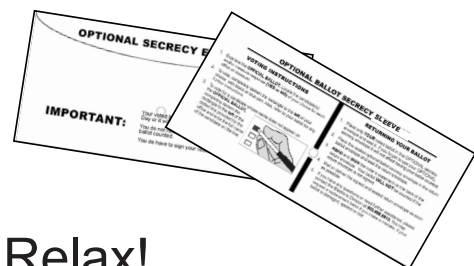
Please do NOT use corrective tape or white out.

REFERRED TO THE PEOPLE BY THE DISTRICT

CAPTION: Five-Year County Sheriff Public Safety Local Option Levy

QUESTION: Shall Clackamas County fund law enforcement with rate of 36.8 cents per \$1,000 assessed value for five years beginning 2022?

This measure may cause property taxes to increase more than three percent.

SUMMARY: This measure would replace the current Public Safety Levy which was approved by voters in 2016 and expires in 2021. Approval of this levy will allow the Clackamas County Sheriff's Office to:

- Support community safety in every part of Clackamas County by providing approximately:
- 34 Sheriff's patrol deputies responding to emergency calls for service and patrolling our roadways;
- 5 Sheriff's detectives to investigate elder abuse/neglect cases; child abuse/neglect cases; human trafficking, and felony crimes against persons
- Maintain 84 jail beds by funding 30 Sheriff's jail deputies. These 84 beds opened upon the passage of the first levy in 2006 and have reduced the number of prisoners released early into the community.
- Open 26 mental health/medical jail beds by funding 6 Sheriff's jail deputies,
- Implement a new body-worn camera program.
- Add 2 internal affairs investigators.
- Maintain funding for Sheriff's specialized drug enforcement team targeting drug traffickers and those involved in drug-related crimes such as identity theft, property crimes, child abuse and neglect.

This measure would cost 36.8 cents per \$1000 of assessed value. The cost would be approximately \$8.19 per month, or \$98.26 per year, on a home with an assessed value of \$267,000 (the median assessed value of a home in Clackamas County). It is estimated the proposed rate would raise \$22.20 million in 2022-23, \$22.87 million in 2023-24, \$23.56 million in 2024-25, \$24.26 million in 2025-26, and \$24.99 million in 2026-27.

The estimated tax cost for this measure is an ESTIMATE ONLY based on the best information available from the county assessor at the time of the estimate and may reflect the impact of early payment discounts, compression and the collection rate.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

Clackamas County voters approved the first Clackamas County Public Safety Local Option Levy in 2006, reapproving levies in 2011 and 2016. The levy provides a portion of the funding for county public safety services.

The current levy, approved in 2016, will expire on December 31, 2021. Measure 3-566 will replace the expiring levy.

The expiring levy provides funding for the following services:

- 84 jail beds in the Clackamas County Jail
- 30 Sheriff's jail deputies
- 18 Sheriff's patrol deputies
- Sheriff's specialized drug enforcement team

A yes vote on Measure 3-566 would maintain and enhance those services by changing the existing Public Safety Local Option Levy tax rate from 24.8 cents to 36.8 cents per \$1000 of assessed value, an increase of 12 cents per \$1000 of assessed

value. That would equal \$32.05 per year for a home at the median assessed value of \$267,000.

A yes vote on Measure 3-566 would:

- Maintain 84 jail beds in the Clackamas County Jail that were opened since the initial passage of the levy in 2006, reducing the number of prisoners released early into the community;
- Provide funding to retain 30 current Sheriff's jail deputies;
- Open 26 mental health/medical jail beds by funding 6 additional Sheriff's jail deputies;
- Retain 18 current Sheriff's patrol deputies and add 16 Sheriff's patrol deputies responding to emergency calls for service and patrolling our roadways;
- Continue the Sheriff's specialized drug enforcement team to arrest drug traffickers and those involved in drug-related crimes such as identity theft, property crimes, and child abuse/neglect;
- Add 5 Sheriff's detectives to investigate elder abuse/neglect cases, child abuse/neglect cases, human trafficking, and felony crimes against persons;
- Implement and maintain a body-worn camera program; and
- Add 2 internal affairs investigators.

This levy is limited to the five-year fiscal period from 2022 through 2027. Future renewals of this levy would not occur without voter approval. The money raised by this measure must be used exclusively for the law enforcement purposes stated in this Ballot Title.

This measure would cost 36.8 cents per \$1000 of assessed value (this is different than the real market value). The cost would be approximately \$ 8.19 per month, or \$ 98.26 per year, on a home with an assessed value of \$267,000 (the median assessed value of a home in Clackamas County). It is estimated the proposed rate would raise \$22.20 million in 2022-23, \$22.87 million in 2023-24, \$23.56 million in 2024-25, \$24.26 million in 2025-26, and \$24.99 million in 2026-27.

2nd - For those who cannot be diverted, we must ensure mental health services within the jail facility are adequate for people's needs.

3rd - For those released from the jail, we need to ensure that they receive the continuation of services and resources they need to stay healthy after they leave.

However matter what programs are available, there will be people experiencing mental health crises that will entail law enforcement intervention. We support the levy because it will improve the quality of services for those subject to intervention and ensure that law enforcement act responsibly with increased accountability.

I love my country, but we do an inadequate job providing accessible behavioral health services. Affordable treatment is hard to find, there's a deficit of providers and stigma about seeking help. People with mental illness and addictions face job discrimination and housing shortage, even when without criminal histories.

We see legions of people with mental illnesses living on the streets. People cycle through ER's, hospitals and jails, often without ever receiving meaningful care - at times left worse off than when they started.

Everyone agrees that jails are not the best place for people with mental illness, but they have become **de facto** our nation's largest psychiatric facilities. In Clackamas County over 35% of our jail inmates take psychiatric medications. 7% report being both homeless and having a mental health or substance use disorder.

I recently learned that our county was one of 15 communities in the U.S. chosen to provide Medication Assisted Treatment for inmates with opioid use disorders. Our jail partners with nonprofits such as NAMI, Mental Health and Addiction Association of America and Bridges to Change to reduce cost and maximize positive outcomes. Jail deputies are trained in suicide prevention, motivational interviewing and cognitive behavioral techniques. They are doing excellent work and using tax payer money wisely, but the magnitude of this crisis still places an impossible burden on our jail.

Beds attached to the jail medical unit sit empty. This levy would fund staffing necessary to open them, reduce isolation, provide group treatment and critical transition supports necessary for inmates to participate in release planning or return to the general population.

We may not like the fact that jails function as mental health facilities, but it would be naive to believe that this will change anytime soon. Inmates with mental illness need this support now.

This is a 50% Hike in this property tax

Currently, this property tax levy is charged at a rate of 24.8 cents per \$1,000 in home/rental property value — this Measure increases the rate to 36 cents, or nearly 50%.

This is not the time to Raise Taxes on Families and Small businesses

Many small businesses and families are behind in lease, rent or mortgage payments because of year-long shutdowns in Clackamas County. In some cases, it will take years to catch up. A hike in property taxes is likely to be passed onto renters, not just homeowners.

Hiking this property tax is not necessary

The Sheriff department, receiving these tax monies, already gets nearly 5% more per year with the existing Levy because of rising property values (*County Tax Assessor*).

Overspends, failing to reassign existing staff

The new County Sheriff wants to continue Drug Enforcement at the same level even though Oregon just decriminalized drug possession in large measure.

The new Sheriff also wants to add jail beds for those arrested and with mental illness even as the state legislature is wanting to keep those inflicted with mental illness out of jail.

Takes Police away from Cities in Clackamas

This expansion of County police could end up taking, luring police employees away from City police departments which struggle just to keep the police they now have.

The Public Input Process for this tax increase is rushed

The new Sheriff rushed this property tax hike before completing an audit of the County police department and its needs. The public is only given one chance to comment on this hike — the same day a decision must be made to place or not place on ballot.

Recommendation: Vote NO. Ask the new Sheriff to return with something reasonable.

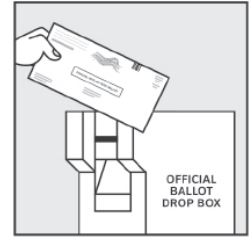
