Impact & purpose of Measure 110, BHRN, BH & Addiction Update, Priority recommendations	<p>What are the current Mental health and substance use needs and gaps in our community?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Workforce-hiring and retention for Community Based Organizations. • A full continuum of services for Substance Use Disorder (SUD) including enhancing residential treatment-youth and adults and withdrawal management (Detox). • Lack of access to the Oregon State Hospital for individuals under civil commitment. • Significant increase of individuals under Aid and Assist Program. <p>How best can we address social detrimental health with high priority populations?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All parts of the system need to address the whole person not just the part they represent. • Housing: if individuals do not have stable and secure housing it is more challenging to engage in their recovery work or attend appointments <p>Impact and Purpose of Measure 110</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ballot Measure 110 (M110), which passed with 58% of the vote is a first-in-the-nation program decriminalizing drug possession and allocating over \$100 million per year in cannabis revenue to expand treatment services.

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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Advocates of M110 hope it will succeed where previous recovery and treatment efforts have failed, especially when it comes to supporting black and indigenous communities and people of color. • “De-criminalization” was implemented before services were put in place. <p>Behavioral Health Resource Network (BHRN)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 17 community based organizations covering 7 dimensions of care. • Screening, Prevention, Housing, Peer services, harm reduction, low barrier treatment, supported employment. • New programs because of M110 funding <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ 4D Recovery-Clackamas County. ○ Recovery Works NW-16 bed withdrawal management program on the border of Clackamas and Multnomah. ○ Transcending Hope-25 new 5 person treatment homes across the tri-county <p>2023 Legislative Update</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • HB 5525 BH Investment Package including direct investments to CMHPs for jail diversion, civil commitment discharge planning and workforce. • HB 2757 Telecom Tax to fund the 988 Line. • Lots of bills died including a bill that included language that would provide more protections to Community Mental Health Programs who are serving the Aid and Assist population <p>Actions the PHAC and Blueprint Steering Committee take between now and June 2025?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tune in to the conversations happening at the local and state level around the Behavioral Health system including M110 and housing. • Weigh in when appropriate. • Know about the local resources available especially around the BHRN and local crisis and support services. • Take a free training at www.gettrainedtohelp.com

Blueprint Community Grant presentation: Clackamas Service Center – Food access</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mission: Clackamas Service Center is an inclusive, “one-stop” Community Center for individuals and families seeking food relief and resources for improved health, dignity, and stability • They are made-up of a team of 12 staff members providing services at both the main center and the food hub- such as hot showers, clothing, hygiene, to-go lunches, grocery pick-ups and deliveries • During the pandemic they opened an outdoor distribution programs and other food site partners and food delivery program and eventually opened the food hub which is an 8000 square foot distribution warehouse. They partner with 21 organizations and are able to expand access to

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	<p>culturally preferred foods for CSC’s programs and other food site partners</p> <p>Blueprint Partner Organizations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Afghan support network • Wichita center • Portland refugee support group • Lot Whitcomb elementary school <p>They were able to provide nutritious whole ingredients to people who are food insecure with a special focus on Latino Eastern European/Russian, and Middle Eastern people, including refugees from Afghanistan resettling in Clackamas County. They helped serve populations that otherwise wouldn’t have access to healthy fresh food.</p> <p>There is a culturally specific food gap in Clackamas County.</p>
