Grants for Phase I implementation of the Blueprint plan were released in September. Up to \$216,000 is available over a multi-year span. This dollar figure may change each year based on available funding. Grant proposals received in late October will be reviewed in early November. Allison Myers and Ann Cluster volunteered to assist with review of the grant proposals. Michael Anderson-Nathe and Steve Campbell will serve as back-ups. BlueprintClackamas.com: The dashboard will be launched at the Clackamas County TEDMED event on December 17 th . The contract with the vender was just approved and PH staff are working with HCI for the creation of the dashboard, selection of health indicators to be tracked and an outreach plan.
