WHAT ACTION ARE YOU REQUESTING FROM THE BOARD?

Staff from Health, Housing & Human Services (H3S) are requesting approval to proceed with a full cost recovery fee schedule for the Public Health Environmental Health Program to be approved by the Board of County Commissioners when they next consider fee increases.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

During the March 26th Policy Session, H3S briefed the Board on:

- The components of the Environmental Health Program, including program responsibilities, the range of services provided, and program funding;
- The adjustments being made to the current fee schedule;
- The reason for those fee adjustments (full program cost recovery); and
- The methodology used to construct the fee schedule.

As was outlined during the March 26th Policy Session, the updated fee schedule, which increases the fee for nearly every type of inspection, is based on a full cost recovery model. As personnel and other program costs have increased over the last few years, the revenue generated from fees has been insufficient to fully cover the costs of operating the program. Clackamas County general fund and revenue from death certificates has been used to make up the difference. The recommended fee adjustments, which reflect the true cost of performing the services, are necessary to eliminate the subsidy and generate the additional \$128,000 in revenue needed to cover program costs.

At the March 26th presentation, the Board requested, to be presented at a future Policy Session, a more detailed explanation of the methodology used to develop the recommended fee schedule, including how the proposed hourly inspection rate was developed and the role of comparables from other jurisdictions. Specifically, the Board requested additional details on:

- The methodology used to develop the hourly inspection rate;
- How the duration of inspection activity, such as the section of restaurants, pools, hotels, etc., is determined; and
- The role fee comparisons with other jurisdictions played in recommended adjustments.

The focus of the 4/30/19 Policy Session will be on the above three topics.

Methodology Used to Develop the Hourly Inspection Rate

Using the number of facilities requiring inspection in Clackamas County, the frequency of required inspections, and the duration of each inspection type as established and enforced by the Oregon Health Authority (including travel time), Environmental Health estimates an annual volume of inspections, expressed in labor hours. This estimated number of hours is then used to determine the number of full-time employees needed to meet program demands. The current program volume requires approximately 7.00 FTE. Total program cost for FY 20, including salary and benefits for the 7.00 FTE, supplies, equipment, mileage and fleet, indirect costs, etc. is \$1,267,302. Based on the anticipated program volume and total program cost, the following methodology is used to calculate an hourly rate for inspections:

1. Annual inspection hours per FTE

The total number of working hours in a year for each FTE is 2,080 annual hours. After accounting for holidays, floating holidays, sick leave, vacation time, training and meetings, and administrative time, which amount to approximately 873 annual hours, each FTE is available to perform 1,207 inspection hours annually.

2. Total annual inspection hours

1,207 inspection hours per FTE X 7.00 FTE = 8,449 total annual inspection hours.

3. Hourly inspection rate

\$1,267,302 (total program costs for FY20) / 8,449 total inspection hours = \$150 per hour

Methodology Used to Develop Fee for Each Environmental Health Inspection Activity

The estimated duration of each inspection activity is established and enforced by the Oregon Health Authority, as mandated by state statute and administrative rules. Environmental Health's hourly inspection rate of \$150 per hour is multiplied by the estimated duration of each type of inspection, plus a local adjustment of 30 minutes for travel time (based on historical program data) to account for the unique geography of our region, to establish the respective fee. A restaurant with 0-15 seats, for example, has an estimated inspection time of 4.6 hours, so the fee is \$690 (4.6 x \$150)

Using Regional Programs to Compare Appropriateness of Clackamas County Fees

Given that inspection activity and inspection times are established by the Oregon Health Authority, as mandated by state statute and administrative rules, regional programs, such as those in Multnomah, Washington, Clark, Marion and Benton Counties serve as valid market-based benchmarks upon which to check the appropriateness of Environmental Health's fees. Those comparisons show that the proposed fees are comparable and any small variation can be accounted for based on differences in personnel costs and program overhead costs.


