May 21, 2024 Primary Election by the Numbers

- 312,859 Eligible Voters. 35.81% Turnout.
- 687 ballots (0.2%) challenged & could not be accepted because of signature issues.
- Election cost per eligible voter \$1.51.
- Election personnel cost per 1,000 ballots processed \$635.




