INTRODUCTION

Clackamas County Health, Housing & Human Services Department through its Children, Family & Community Connections (CFCC) Division is seeking applications from multiple agencies/organizations that are capable of delivering evidence-based parent education class series. The non-federal funding sources for this opportunity are Oregon Community Foundation and Oregon State University. A total of \$135,000 is currently available for the time period July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2021. More funding may be received and disbursed in this time, and grants may be extended up to five years. The current amount will be disbursed as follows:

- Up to \$45,000 for early childhood parenting series (birth to 6 years old) targeting parents who reside in Clackamas County;
- Up to \$45,000 for parenting series targeting parents of elementary, middle, and/or high school aged children (10 to 16 years old) who reside in Clackamas County;
- Up to \$45,000 for parenting series targeting parents of elementary, middle, and/or high school aged children (10 to 16 years old) residing in Multnomah County.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

a. OVERVIEW

By providing high quality, evidence-based parenting education series to parents and caregivers in our community CFCC aims to increase positive parent child relationships, reduce parental stress and isolation and increase academic success for students, including preparation for kindergarten.

b. GOAL

Provide evidence-based parent education class series to parents of children ages birth to 6 years old living in Clackamas County, and parents of children ages 10 to 16 years old living in Clackamas and Multnomah Counties. Successful applicants will demonstrate the ability to offer high quality, evidence-based parenting education class series to universal and/or target populations. Successful class series will meet all fidelity requirements designated by the curriculum publisher and have a successful parent retention rate of at least 75% of participants attending at least 70% of class sessions offered. Additionally, 75% of class participant will report an increase in quality of parent-child/youth interactions as measured by Parenting Skills Ladder (PSL) responses.

c. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

- Quarterly reporting on class participation and parent/child skill improvement
- Quarterly reporting on class facilitation, including how many classes were held during the quarter and how the organization is meeting fidelity requirements related to expectations of the curriculum publisher and the Oregon Parenting Education Collaborative

- Annual site visit of parenting class from Clackamas Parenting Together HUB staff

Eligible applicants are nonprofit organizations, schools, or public entities serving residents of Clackamas and/or Multnomah County. Eligible projects must address goals identified above and result in positive, measurable outcomes for parents and their children.

Successful applicants will meet the following criteria:

- Demonstrate capacity and willingness to provide evidence-based parent education services to a variety of populations, including, but not limited to those who are English language learners, low income, living in rural communities, or who are otherwise traditionally underserved;
- Commit to conducting <u>a minimum of two and a maximum of six separate class series</u> over the funding period.
