WHAT ACTION ARE YOU REQUESTING FROM THE BOARD?

Board review and approval of Business Development Grant Awards.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The Board directed the Office of Economic Development (OED) in April of 2024 to develop a Business Development Grant Awards program in the amount of \$600,000 to invest in local businesses to ensure their ongoing success in the County. The grant program provides funding to existing traded sector businesses of various sizes to relocate to or expand operations in Clackamas County. As directed by the Board, this is a competitive grant program developed by staff with final Board approval of all potential awards.

Through a public application process, OED received 34 total applications. 17 applications met the staffdetermined eligibility criteria. These 17 applications had a total funding request of \$1,153,154.50.

Eligibility Criteria:

- Traded Sector
- Located in or Relocating to Clackamas County
- Project Types: Capital Purchase or Workforce Development
- Match Requirements: 100% or More
- Active Registration with Secretary of State
- Established 2 or More Years Ago
- Must Remain in the County for 2 years after Funding Awarded

Staff from OED, Oregon's Mt. Hood Territory and Water Environment Services formed a Review & Recommendation Committee (R&RC) to review eligible applicants and determine funding recommendations.

Of the 17 applicants that met the eligibility criteria, the R&RC recommends 11 recipients (Attachment A) for Board approval. Of the 11 recommended recipients, 10 currently operate within the County (2 of which will relocate manufacturing processes to the County) and 1 recipient will fully relocate their business to the County.

Upon Board approval, staff will initiate the development of Funding Agreements with each grant recipient and advance Funding Agreements to the Board for approval. Staff aim to have all grant awards fully allocated to recipients by April of 2025.

Summary of Grant Recommendations: Industries

Based on the data received in the Office of Economic Development's 2023 Economic Landscape Analysis (ELA), there are five top private **anchor industry clusters** in Clackamas County that provide over 45,000 jobs and revenue of approximately \$6.13 billion for the local economy. The supply chains for these sectors support an additional 36,000 jobs and \$3.53 billion in revenue.

These industries include Advanced Manufacturing, Food Systems, Logistics, Healthcare, and High Tech.

Stumptown Coffee Corp

Project Location: 9151 SE McBrod Ave, Milwaukie, 97222 Capital Project Funding Request: \$100,000 Funding Recommendation: \$100,000

Company Profile

Stumptown Coffee Roasters was founded in Portland, Oregon in 1999 and is a Northwest based brand producing roasted bagged whole bean and ground coffee and canned and bottled cold brew coffee for grocery stores, wholesalers, ecommerce and for the 9 retail stores owned throughout the U.S.

Project Summary

- Relocate cold brew extraction, canning and bottling operations from SE Portland to Milwaukie
- Capital need to upgrade current warehouse & distribution center to include manufacturing facility and support expanded operations
- Relocate existing and purchase new extraction equipment, brewing tanks, storage tanks, and packaging equipment to support cold brew manufacturing
- Build cooler in the warehouse bringing cold chain warehousing and distribution of cold brew coffee finished goods in-house
- Bring on additional packaging formats which will increase Stumptown presence in the market

- Relocation of production operations into Clackamas County

GrowLife Inc (Bridgetown Mushrooms)

Company Profile

Founded in 2018 in Tigard, Oregon, Bridgetown Mushrooms is a USDA Organic mushroom farm that cultivates fresh specialty mushrooms for distribution throughout the West Coast. Bridgetown has experienced exponential demand, having starting cultivation in a single 100 sq ft grow chamber and expanded current operations across three 700 sq ft warehouse spaces (totaling 2,100 sq ft). Increasing demand has exceeded the Company's spatial capacity for over a year.

Project Summary

- Relocate from Washington County to a 22,000 square foot facility in unincorporated Canby (10x current operation square footage)
- Grant funding will help support relocating and expanding into new facility with capital investments including automated equipment, HVAC and humidification systems, rolling racks, and refrigerated vehicle
- Expansion based on demand current West Coast distributor and exclusive partnerships with Whole Foods and Sprouts are set to expand once operating in Canby

- Full relocation of business into Clackamas County
- Expected annual revenue at new facility of \$10 million

Overland Van Project

Project Summary

- Project will add new capabilities on CNC Milling, Electric Discharge Machining and expand the company's CNC Swiss Turning

- Added manufacturing capabilities with new component prototyping and manufacturing processes will retain and expand customer base
- Increase tax base: business personal property acquisitions
- Business expansion and retention
- Production improvements could lead to additional hiring

Trails End Spirits LLC
