Understanding community planning organizations

What are they?

If you live in unincorporated Clackamas County, a community planning organization (CPO) is a great way to have a voice in strengthening the livability of your community. These organizations are run by volunteers — your neighbors and friends — who care about community challenges and growth issues where you live.

How often do they meet?

Some CPOs meet every month and some meet twice a year. Learn more on our website.

What do CPOs have to do with land use?

Community planning organizations are responsible for helping the Board of County Commissioners, the Planning Department, and the Planning Commission on land use matters affecting their areas.

The county notifies CPOs of proposed land use actions and legislative changes that could impact their areas. The organization may review these applications and make recommendations about the proposed actions, changes and appeals.

Why should I get involved?

- Meet other people in your community. In addition to working on growth and development matters, some organizations plan other gatherings and events.
- Learn about land use projects being proposed in your area. If you heard about something going on in your community, your CPO may be a great place to find out more.
- Participating in a community planning organization is a great way to have a voice and connection with your county government.
