RESOLUTION NO. 14-383

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DAMASCUS, OREGON, CALLING AN ELECTION TO SUBMIT TO THE VOTERS AT THE NOVEMBER 4, 2014, ELECTION A COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AND ASSOCIATED DOCUMENTS

WHEREAS, Oregon law requires that all Oregon cities prepare and adopt a comprehensive plan and implementing land use regulations pursuant to ORS 197.010 in compliance with the Oregon Land Conservation and Development Commission's Statewide Planning Goals;

WHEREAS, the City Council determined it in the best interest of the City to authorize Mayor Spinnett to form a work group and prepare a draft Comprehensive Plan and supporting documents;

WHEREAS, Mayor Spinnett has completed his respective draft Comprehensive Plan (the "Plan");

WHEREAS, at the May 20, 2014 election, the Plan was submitted to the electors and, while it didn't receive a majority, it did receive the most votes of all the Plans before the electors at the election.

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that establishment of land use regulations is a matter of City-wide importance and finds it in the best interest of the City to refer the Plan and associated documents (including a Comprehensive Plan Map, Economic Opportunities Analysis, Housing Needs Analysis, Buildable Lands Inventory, Natural Features Inventory (Natural Resources Report and Natural Hazards Report), Transportation System Plan, Integrated Water Capital Plan, Development Code, Zoning Map and Findings of Fact in support of these associated documents, collectively referred to as the "Documents") to the voters for citizen approval at the November 4, 2014 election.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE DAMASCUS CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: An election is hereby called in and for the City of Damascus, Oregon, for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of

the City the following question:

Shall the City approve the Comprehensive Plan referred by the City Council and the associated land use documents?

Section 2: Tuesday, November 4, 2014, is hereby designated as the date for holding the election for the purpose of voting on the

measure.

Section 3: The election will be conducted by the Clackamas County

Elections Department.

Section 4: The precincts for said election shall be and constitute all of

the territory included within the corporate limits of the City of

Damascus.

Section 5: The Damascus City Council authorizes the Mayor, the City

Manager (each an "authorized representative") or a

designee of the authorized representative to act on behalf of the City of Damascus and to take such further action as is necessary to carry out the intent and purposes herein in

compliance with the applicable provisions of law.

Section 6: Pursuant to ORS 250.275(5), the Damascus City Council

directs the City Elections Officer to file with the Clackamas County Elections Office, a Notice of City Measure Election in substantially the form of the attached and incorporated Exhibit A, on a date no earlier than the eighth business day after the date on which Exhibit A is filed with the City

Elections Officer, but in any event, no later than

September 4, 2014. The Clackamas County Elections Office

is required to produce and disseminate a facsimile of the

ballot in accordance with ORS 254.205.

Section 7: Pursuant to ORS 251.345, the Damascus City Council

directs the City Manager to cause to be prepared a Measure Explanatory Statement which will summarize the key

material provisions, economic impacts, and costs imposed to residents, for publication in the Clackamas County Voters' Pamphlet; said statement shall be filed with the Clackamas County Elections Office at the same time the Notice of City

Measure Election is filed by the City Elections Officer.

Section 8: The Act, containing the full text of the Plan and Documents.

is attached hereto as exhibits and incorporated in this

Resolution by reference.

Section 9: This Resolution shall become effective immediately.

The City Council referred the Plan to the voters on June 16, 2014, after public hearings before the Council at which public testimony was received.

If approved by a majority at this election, the Plan will be submitted to the Oregon Land Conservation and Development Commission ("LCDC") to begin the acknowledgement process, in which LCDC acknowledges that the Comprehensive Plan is consistent with the statewide planning goals.

A vote of "no" rejects the Plan.

COST SUMMARY

The Plan does not adopt any fees and charges. The Plan establishes policy that only property owners that develop their property will be responsible for costs associated with public infrastructure needed to support growth.

The figures in the below cost summary reflect the projected costs to build, operate, and maintain, water and transportation infrastructure to serve Damascus for the next 20 years. The financial analysis that generated the projected costs was performed by the City Engineer and covers public infrastructure identified in the Integrated Water Capital Plans and the Transportation System Plan. A copy of the full financial analysis may be obtained at City Hall.

Water Infrastructure

The City intends to work with Sunrise Water Authority and Clackamas County Water Environmental Services. It is anticipated that these service providers will own and operate the major water infrastructure in the City. The Integrated Water Capital Plan includes costs for four water systems proposed to serve Damascus: drinking water, non-potable water, wastewater, and storm water. The analysis included estimated costs for capital construction, operation, and maintenance. The estimated costs are as follows:

Water Infrastructure Construction Cost Estimates

Drinking water: \$93,300,000 Non-Potable Water: \$45,800,000

Wastewater Collection and Treatment: \$99,060,000

Stormwater: \$4,866,000

Total Water Capital Costs: \$ 243,026,000

Water Infrastructure Annual Operation and Maintenance Costs Estimates

Drinking Water Treatment: \$1,600,000

Drinking Water and Non-Potable Water Distribution: \$2,046,000

Wastewater Treatment: \$1,278,000 Wastewater Collection: \$4,788,000 Stormwater Detention: \$226,000 Total Water O&M: \$9,938,000

Transportation Infrastructure

The Transportation System Plan identified twenty-two key projects to serve the 20-year period. These projects include refinement plans, roadways including bicycle and pedestrian facilities, intersection improvements, and right-of-way acquisitions. The estimated costs for these projects are as follows:

Transportation Projects - Construction: \$320,480,000

Transportation Projects – Annual Operations and Maintenance: \$1,248,800
