Committee Reports		Finance Committee – Mike reported that revenue has been slow to come in which is normal this early in the fiscal year. Health Centers remain on track to meet revenue projections. Ed reported that Health Centers recently received quality funds from Care Oregon in the amount of \$187,000. This funding is contingent on meeting a variety of quality metrics.

		QI Committee – Patient Safety and Patient Experience reports were provided to QI Committee. Discussed strategic goals and an update was provided on Primary Care, Behavioral Health, and Dental. More will be discussed at the next QI Committee meeting.		
		Andrew's credentialing review was completed. As he is the Medical Director, he is unable to review himself. Deborah and James completed his review.

Staff Reports		Health Centers is opening a Pediatric Dental Clinic in the Gladstone Children and Family Center. Care Oregon is providing funding for this work. Construction started last week. First patient must be seen by January 5 th .		
		Staff sponsored a Harvest Festival in Gladstone where more then 420 kids came and most parents took flyers on the new dental clinic.		

		Work on the Sandy Clinic is ongoing. Staff got together recently to do space planning.

Supported Employment		Margaret Moore presented on the Supported Employment program at the Health Centers. She mentioned that Clackamas ranks 2 nd in the State of Oregon for its Supported Employment program based on the most recent evaluation. In that evaluation, the program received 115 of a possible 125 points which gives the county an "Exemplary" rating.
NAMI Clackamas Countract Renewal	Action	Michelle Veenker, Executive Director of NAMI Clackamas, presented to the Council about the work NAMI is doing in the county and what they would like to do with a renewed grant of \$60,000 from the Health Council. She emphasized that the \$60,0000 grant has allowed NAMI to fully fund a volunteer coordinator position which coordinates more than 100 volunteers through the county. To date in 2019, volunteers have worked more than 3200 hours valued at more than \$82,000. Tom opened the floor for a motion to renew the grant of \$60,000 for NAMI Clackamas.

Service Area Competition Submission Process	Action	James gave a brief explanation of the Service Area Competition Submission to HRSA, which is required for the Health Centers to maintain its status as an FQHC. A vote was held to approve James to submit the SAC grant application. Motion: Mary motioned to approve James to apply for the SAC grant. Second: Linda seconded.
