These funds, which have been in the community for more than 25 years, help provide a safety net to protect the most economically vulnerable. EFSP is preparing to launch its <i>Phase 39 funding cycle</i> , as well as its distribution of American Rescue Plan (ARPA) funds. Clackamas County anticipates receiving \$149,615					
	in Phase 39 funds and \$462,426 in ARPA funds to distribute within Clackamas County. The Community Action Board (CAB) provides guidance on the amount the county designates to specific allocation categories – Mass Shelter, Food, and Rental Assistance. Previous CAB Recommendations
