If you prefer, instead of mailing your ballot, you may take it to the Elections Office or to one of the Drop Site Locations listed on page 4 of this pamphlet. Drop boxes will be available at these locations from February 24 through March 13.

If a ballot was delivered to your residence for someone who should no longer be receiving ballots at your address, please write "RETURN" on the envelope and place it back in your mail box. If a ballot was sent to someone who is deceased, please write "DECEASED" on the envelope and place it back in your mailbox.

The address for Internet access for election results is on page 75. Information regarding cable broadcast of results election night is on page 61. A calendar for 2001 elections and voter pamphlet deadlines is on page 3.

BALLOT TITLE

EXPANDS OREGON CITY BOUNDARIES TO INCLUDE ADDITIONAL LAND.

QUESTION: Shall the City's boundaries be expanded to include 1.86 acres of additional land in the southeast part of the City?

SUMMARY: This measure would expand the City's boundaries by approximately 1.86 acres by including within the City property described as follows: A 1.86-acre area of land bordered on the east by Highway 213 and the Community College and to the west by Molalla Avenue, just north of the intersection of Molalla and 213, and which includes the adjacent street right-of-way for Molalla Avenue. The area is more particularly described as follows: Tax Lot 3200 of the NE ¼ Sec. 8, T3S, R2E, W.M., Clackamas County, Oregon.

The property is proposed for annexation to obtain urban services to enable development in conjunction with adjacent property that is already within the City. The property meets all state, regional and City requirements for annexation into the City and services can be adequately provided to the property. The property is currently zoned "I" (industrial) and is located within the City's urban growth boundary.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

If passed, this measure would approve expansion of the City limits of the City of Oregon City by 1.86 acres.

PROPERTY LOCATION:

The property is located generally in the southeast part of the City bordered on the east by Highway 213 and the Community College and to the west by Molalla Avenue, just north of the intersection of Molalla and 213, and which includes the adjacent street right-of-way for Molalla Avenue. The area is more particularly described as follows: Tax Lot 3200 of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 8, T3S, R2E, W.M., Clackamas County, Oregon.

PROPERTY DESCRIPTION:

The property is proposed for annexation to obtain urban services to enable development in conjunction with adjacent property that is already within the City. Development is to consist of the Oregon Orthopedic & Sports Medicine Clinic. The adjacent properties within the City which would be part of the development are Tax Lots 3300 and 3400. It was recommended that the annexation be modified to include the adjacent Molalla Avenue right-of-way which is in accord with the City-County Urban Growth Management Agreement.

SERVICE AVAILABILITY:

Upon approval of annexation, the City shall transfer the fire and police services from Clackamas County Rural Fire Protection District #1 and Clackamas Sheriff's Department to Oregon City Fire Department (under contract with the Tualatin Valley Fire & Rescue) and Oregon City Police Department. In addition, transportation facilities, water facilities, and storm sewerage facilities are available or can be made available to the subject site.

The City Commission of Oregon City conducted a public hearing and approved sending this request to the voters and set the date of election for March 13, 2001.

BALLOT TITLE

EXPANDS OREGON CITY BOUNDARIES TO INCLUDE ADDITIONAL LAND.

QUESTION: Shall the City's boundaries be expanded to include 0.4 acres of additional land in the southwest part of the City?

SUMMARY: This measure would expand the City's boundaries by approximately 0.4 acres by including within the City property described as follows: An area of land located on the south edge of Central Point Road and the west edge of White Lane, including the adjacent street right-of-way for Central Point Road and White Lane. The area is more particularly described as follows: Tax Lot 1401 of the SE 1/4, Sec. 12, T3S, R1E, W.M., Clackamas County, Oregon.

The property is proposed for annexation to obtain urban services to enable development of the site with 1-2 residences. The property meets all state, regional and City requirements for annexation into the City and services can be adequately provided to the property. The property is currently zoned FU-10 (future urbanizable with a 10-acre minimum lot size) and is located within the City's urban growth boundary.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

If passed, this measure would approve expansion of the City limits of the City of Oregon City by 0.4 acres.

PROPERTY LOCATION:

The property is located generally in the southwest part of the City on the south edge of Central Point Road and the west edge of White Lane, including the adjacent street rights-of-way for Central Point Road and White Lane. The property contains 0.4 acres, is vacant and has an assessed value of \$48,370. The site is identified by County Assessor Maps as Tax Lot 1401 of the SE 1/4, Section 12, T3S, R1E, W.M., Clackamas County, Oregon.

PROPERTY DESCRIPTION:

The property is proposed for annexation to obtain City services to enable the parcel to be developed with 1-2 residences. The contract purchaser of this parcel is the developer of the adjacent Payson Farms subdivision, a recently approved subdivision containing 40 lots currently under construction. All urban services are being extended to Payson Farms to serve that development and the subject site would add one or at most, two new homes. Street improvements required by the City for residential areas are being made to the frontage abutting the subject site (on both White Lane and Central Point Road) by the developer of Payson Farms.

SERVICE AVAILABILITY:

Upon approval of annexation, the City shall transfer the fire and police services from Clackamas County Rural Fire Protection District #1 and Clackamas Sheriff's Department to Oregon City Fire Department (under a contract with the Tualatin Valley Fire & Rescue) and Oregon City Police Department. In addition, transportation facilities, water facilities and storm sewerage facilities are available or can be made available to the subject site.



Measure 3-29. City of Oregon City



BALLOT TITLE

EXPANDS OREGON CITY BOUNDARIES TO INCLUDE ADDITIONAL LAND.

QUESTION: Shall the City's boundaries be expanded to include 1.46 acres of additional land in the southeast side of the City?

SUMMARY: This measure would expand the City's boundaries by approximately 1.46 acres by including within the City property described as follows:

An area of land located on the west side of Beavercreek Road adjacent to Moss Junior High School and more particularly described as follows: Tax Lots 500 and 600 of the SE 1/4, Sec. 9, T3S, R2E, W.M., Clackamas County, Oregon.

The property proposed for annexation is to be included in a larger development, the balance of which is already inside the City. The development consists of the conversion of Moss Junior High School into a high school for the Oregon City School District.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

If passed, this measure would approve expansion of the City limits of the City of Oregon City by 1.46 acres.

PROPERTY LOCATION:

The property is located generally on the southeast side of the City, on the west edge of Beavercreek Road north of its intersection with Glen Oak Road. The property contains one single family dwelling and is evaluated at \$319,340. The property is identified by County Assessor Maps as Tax Lots 500 and 600 of the SE ½, Sec. 9, T3S, R2E, W.M., City of Oregon City, Clackamas County, Oregon.

PROPERTY DESCRIPTION:

The property is to be included in a larger development, the balance of which is already inside the City. The development consists of conversion of Moss Junior High School into a high school.

PROPOSAL NO. AN 00-06:

The Planning Commission review was excepted as allowed for by Section 12 of the City's annexation ordinance. Furthermore, in order to expedite this school conversion project, the City has agreed to set this matter for an election (as required by City Charter) prior to the City Commission's hearing and substantive review of the proposed annexation.

Upon approval of annexation, the City may transfer the fire and police services from Clackamas County Rural Fire Protection District #1 and Clackamas Sheriff's Department to Oregon City Fire Department and Oregon City Police Department. In addition, transportation facilities, water facilities, and storm sewerage facilities are available or can be made available to the subject site.

The City Commission of Oregon City approved sending this proposed annexation to the voters of Oregon City and set the date of election for March 13, 2001.



Measure No. 3-32

BALLOT TITLE

LOCAL OPTION TAX FOR FIRE AND EMS PERSONNEL.

QUESTION: Shall Canby Fire District impose \$0.43 per \$1,000 of assessed value for five years beginning in Fiscal year 2001/2002? This measure may cause property taxes to increase more than three percent.

SUMMARY: This measure may be passed only at an election with at least a 50 percent voter turnout.

Canby Fire District has experienced rapid growth in the number of calls for service. Total incidents responded to in year 1991 were 968. In year 2000, the Fire District responded to 1684 incidents, an increase of 73%. Population growth during the same period was 36%. Along with Fire and Rescue response, Canby Fire District also provides the areas Ambulance service. Due to this growth, the number of hours per day that the Fire District's Ambulance is unavailable for immediate response is about 3 hours per day.

Funds generated by this Local Option tax will be used to hire five additional Firefighter/EMTs, one Training Officer, and one Fire Prevention Officer. The Firefighter/EMT and Training Officer positions are necessary to provide a dedicated Ambulance Crew and reduce delays in service. The Fire Prevention Officer position is necessary to improve the Fire Districts fire and life safety programs, and maintain a positive partnership with the business community.

Estimated amount of tax to be collected in each year is as follows: 2001/2002 - \$433,501; 2002/2003 - \$446,506; 2003/2004 - \$459,901; 2004/2005 - \$473,698; 2005/2006 - \$487,909.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

Canby Rural Fire Protection District No. 62, serves approx. 30,000 residents of Canby, Barlow, and surrounding rural areas. The district encompasses 52 square miles of mixed property uses from residential to light industrial and some of the Willamette Valley's largest nurseries.

The district provides fire protection, fire prevention services, swift-water rescue, community emergency response teams, and comprehensive public education programs. Programs include child safety car-seat inspections, blood pressure checks, free smoke detectors with installation for those in need. The fire district is a leader in emergency management for the community, taking an active role in disaster preparedness and education.

The district provides the community's emergency advanced life support ambulance service. The fire district's paramedics provide state of the art medical services. As needed, they use leading edge technology and techniques to manage emergency health care needs.

In 1991 the population of the City of Canby was 9,370 and the fire district responded to 968 incidents. Volunteers and two firefighter/paramedics on duty provided 24 hour staffing. By 2000 the population of the City of Canby had grown to 13,100 and the fire district responded to 1684 incidents, staffed as in 1991. However, within the last 2 years, 3 firefighter/paramedics have been hired to ensure service responses levels during daytime hours when fewer volunteers are available.

Since 1991, the population has grown approximately 36% with the number of incidents increasing by 73%. Currently, due to increased

incidents, the ambulance is unavailable for immediate response approximately 3 hours per day. The closest back-up unit is in Oregon City, resulting in increased response times of up to 10 minutes or longer, depending upon unit availability.

To address the impact of increased population and incident responses on service levels, Canby Fire District is seeking voter authorization to impose a five-year local option tax, not to exceed \$0.43 (cents) per \$1,000 assessed value. If approved, the proceeds will fund the following staffing:

- 1) 5 additional firefighter/paramedics to provide coverage during periods when the primary ambulance is unavailable. These firefighter/paramedics, with current staff realignment, will enable the fire district to meet service level needs. This enables the staffing of two ambulances without depleting resources for additional emergency incidents.
- 2) Fire Prevention Officer to assist the Fire Marshal in delivery of public education, fire prevention and life safety programs, as well as maintaining a positive partnership with the business community. This individual will be credentialed and available to provide emergency services.
- 3) Training officer. This individual will ensure Fire District personnel maintain the skills necessary to meet the needs of the community and credentials required by the following regulatory bodies:

Oregon Department of Public Safety Standards and Training

Oregon State Health Division

National Fire Protection Association

OR-OSHA

Oregon State Fire Marshal's Office, and

Oregon Board of Medical Examiners

This individual will be credentialed and available to provide emergency services.

If the levy were assessed at its full rate, the owner of a house with an assessed value of \$150,000 would pay an additional \$5.38 per month.

ARGUMENT IN FAVOR

CANBY FIRE FIGHTERS URGE A YES VOTE MEASURE ON 3-32 Canby Fire Fighters are asking you to vote yes on MEASURE 3-32.

For over 65 years Canby Fire District has provided the citizens of Canby and the surrounding area with comprehensive, compassionate and fast fire and emergency medical service.

Since 1991 Canby Fire District has:

- · Built a new Headquarters Station
- · Replaced an aging fleet of emergency vehicles
- Added Fire Fighters during the day to supplement fewer available volunteers

- Hire an additional Training Officer. Career and Volunteer Fire fighters are required to maintain extensive annual training.
- Hire a Fire Prevention Officer. This position will assist the Fire Marshal in delivery of Fire Prevention Education and Life Safety Programs. Provide expanded services to the growing business community.

Join Canby Fire Fighters in supporting Local Option Levy 3-32 to improve response times, ensure fire fighter safety and keep your fire fighters prepared for emergency situations.

This Local Option Levy allows you to control emergency service levels in YOUR Community.

ROSEMONT FIRE

Measure No. 3-33

BALLOT TITLE

DISSOLUTION OF THE ROSEMONT RURAL FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT.

QUESTION: Shall the Rosemont Fire District be dissolved and its assets transferred to the Tualatin Valley Fire and Rescue?

SUMMARY: This measure will dissolve the Rosemont Rural Fire Protection District effective upon annexation of the territory to Tualatin Valley Fire and Rescue, but not sooner than July 1, 2001.

The Plan of Dissolution and Liquidation provides for the transfer and conveyance of all assets to, and assumption of all outstanding indebtedness by, Tualatin Valley Fire and Rescue. The Plan of Dissolution and Liquidation is available for examination at the office of the county clerk.

The Rosemont Rural Fire District provides no direct service. Rather, it contracts for fire and emergency services with the City of West Linn which, in turn, contracts with Tualatin Valley Fire and Rescue. Fees charged by the City of West Linn to the Rosemont Rural Fire District exceed property taxes collected within the district for fire and emergency services. This currently results in the district augmenting payments with its limited reserves and will soon result in insufficient funds to provide continued service.

The purpose of this measure is to stabilize funding for fire and emergency services and to ensure continued fire protection to area residents.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

While in years past the Rosemont Rural Fire District enjoyed the benefit of an active contingent of volunteer firefighters, changing demographics within the community have contributed to a decline in the number of citizens able to contribute in such a fashion. Therefore, current fire and emergency services is provided under contract by the City of West Linn which, in turn, has contracted with Tualatin Valley Fire and Rescue.

District property owners are currently assessed \$.48 per one thousand dollars of assessed property value, which the Board of Directors has determined is insufficient to fund competent reliable fire and emergency services for the District's residents. Additionally, the current contract with the City of West Linn requires payment in excess of property taxes levied and has resulted in the district spending its reserves to fund basic fire protection. Soon, the district's limited financial reserves will be exhausted leaving the Rosemont area without essential fire and emergency services.

Because the district cannot expect its neighboring jurisdictions to provide fire and emergency services at a rate below that charged their own property owners, the Board of Directors has determined annexation to Tualatin Valley Fire and Rescue as the District's most desirable option. Tualatin Valley is a rural fire protection district serving both incorporated and unincorporated areas adjacent to the Rosemont district, and, while its permanent rate of \$1.52 per thousand dollars of assessed property value is higher than Rosemont's current rate, it is lower than other fire districts in the area.

Tualatin Valley Fire and Rescue provides a wide range of services including fire suppression, emergency medical services, rescue ser-

vices, fire prevention and public education. All of Tualatin Valley's career stations are paramedic-staffed.

Tualatin Valley's role as a regional provider enables it to respond with a large number of firefighters in a short period of time without relying on other jurisdictions. Further, Tualatin Valley has several water tenders which are critical in Rosemont where water is scarce.
