This measure dissolves Boring Fire District. The dissolution's purpose is to allow the Boring Fire territory to be annexed by Clackamas County Fire District #1. (Oregon law requires a fire district to be dissolved before its territory can be annexed by another fire district.) Since July 1, 2014, Clackamas Fire has furnished fire protection, fire prevention and emergency medical services to the Boring Fire area under an intergovernmental agreement between the districts. If the dissolution and annexation (separate measures) are both approved, all assets and liabilities of Boring Fire shall be transferred to and assumed by Clackamas Fire under the plan of dissolution available for inspection at the office of the Clackamas County Board of Commissioners. Boring Fire's permanent tax rate of \$2.3771 per \$1,000 of assessed property value would increase to Clackamas Fire's permanent rate of \$2.4012 per \$1,000 of assessed value beginning the 2017-2018 fiscal year. This represents a \$2.41 estimated annual increase for each \$100,000 in assessed value, along with annual estimated bond costs of \$10 for each \$100,000 in assessed value.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT FOR CLACKAMAS COUNTY VOTERS' PAMPHLET BORING RFPD#59 MEASURE

(BALLOT TITLE CAPTION: Authorizes dissolution of Boring Rural Fire Protection District #59) (WORD COUNT OF EXPLANATORY STATEMENT: 433)

Effective beginning July 1, 2014, Boring Fire District entered into a five-year intergovernmental agreement whereby Clackamas Fire District #1 furnishes fire protection, fire prevention and emergency medical services to the Boring Fire District area. Under the terms of the agreement, all Boring Fire employees became employees of Clackamas Fire District #1, and Boring Fire District pays a fee to Clackamas Fire District #1 covering all services and expenses, adjusted annually based on increases in Boring Fire District's assessed value. The proposed dissolution/annexation would result in the permanent integration of Boring Fire into Clackamas Fire, thereby terminating the existing intergovernmental agreement.

Clackamas Fire District #1 is one of the largest fire protection districts in Oregon, serving approximately 220,000 citizens within the cities of Happy Valley, Johnson City, Milwaukie, Oregon City and the unincorporated areas of Carver, Beavercreek, Carus, Central Point, Clarkes, Damascus, Oak Lodge, Redland, South End, Sunnyside and Westwood. The district provides a wide range of services including fire suppression, advanced life support, emergency medical care, fire prevention, swift water rescue, hazardous materials response, Community Emergency Response Teams, emergency management, community education and other programs. The district responds to communities' needs from 20 strategically located community fire stations with a workforce of approximately 256 employees and 100 volunteers.

Boring Fire's permanent tax rate of \$2.3771 per \$1,000 of assessed property value would increase to Clackamas Fire's permanent rate of \$2.4012 per \$1,000 of assessed value beginning in the 2017-2018 fiscal year. This represents a \$2.41 estimated annual increase for each \$100,000 in assessed property value.

In addition, Clackamas Fire District #1 has a 2015 general obligation bond with an approximate levy rate estimated to be \$.10 (ten cents) per \$1,000 of assessed value and the bonds will retire within 16 years of issuance of each series. The estimated cost per each \$100,000 of assessed property value would be \$10 per year until retirement of the bonds.

The bonds fund capital costs for improvements throughout Clackamas Fire District #1, which would include the Boring Fire District territory if the dissolution and annexation measures are approved. For example, the bonds finance the construction and equipping of new facilities, the purchase of emergency apparatus and firefighting equipment, and the improvement of district facilities focusing on safety and service delivery.

The board of directors of Boring Fire District has determined that integration of the district into Clackamas Fire District #1 by means of the proposed dissolution and annexation is in the best interests of the Boring Fire District residents, and the board therefore submits this question of dissolution to the District voters as required by state law.
