



CCSO WRITTEN DIRECTIVES – SHERIFF’S PROMULGATION

1. The Clackamas County Sheriff’s Office (CCSO) written directives were first established on September 2, 2013; superseding the CCSO Manual of Rules and Regulations of October 15, 2002 and General Orders issued prior to September 1, 2013.
2. The written directives are now available by electronic format utilizing PowerDMS software and are divided into two main components: (1) CCSO policies that provide formal direction concerning the overall governance and administration of the Sheriff’s Office, and (2) CCSO technical and operating procedures that guide the accomplishment of division, section, unit and individual employee tasks and responsibilities. Although they do not address all possible circumstances, they establish a level of service and prudence expected by all employees. As an employee, it is my expectation that each of you will abide by and apply these written directives attendant to your employment and oath of office.
3. CCSO employees will often be required to deal with complex and challenging circumstances in the performance of their duties. It is, however, the expectation of the community that while you are either performing your duties or in the absence of a specific directive, you will conduct yourself by embodying the philosophy, vision, and core values outlined in the *Principles of the CCSO*. These principles, in part, help establish the cornerstone upon which all of us will be guided in our professional conduct and service to the Community, State and Country.
