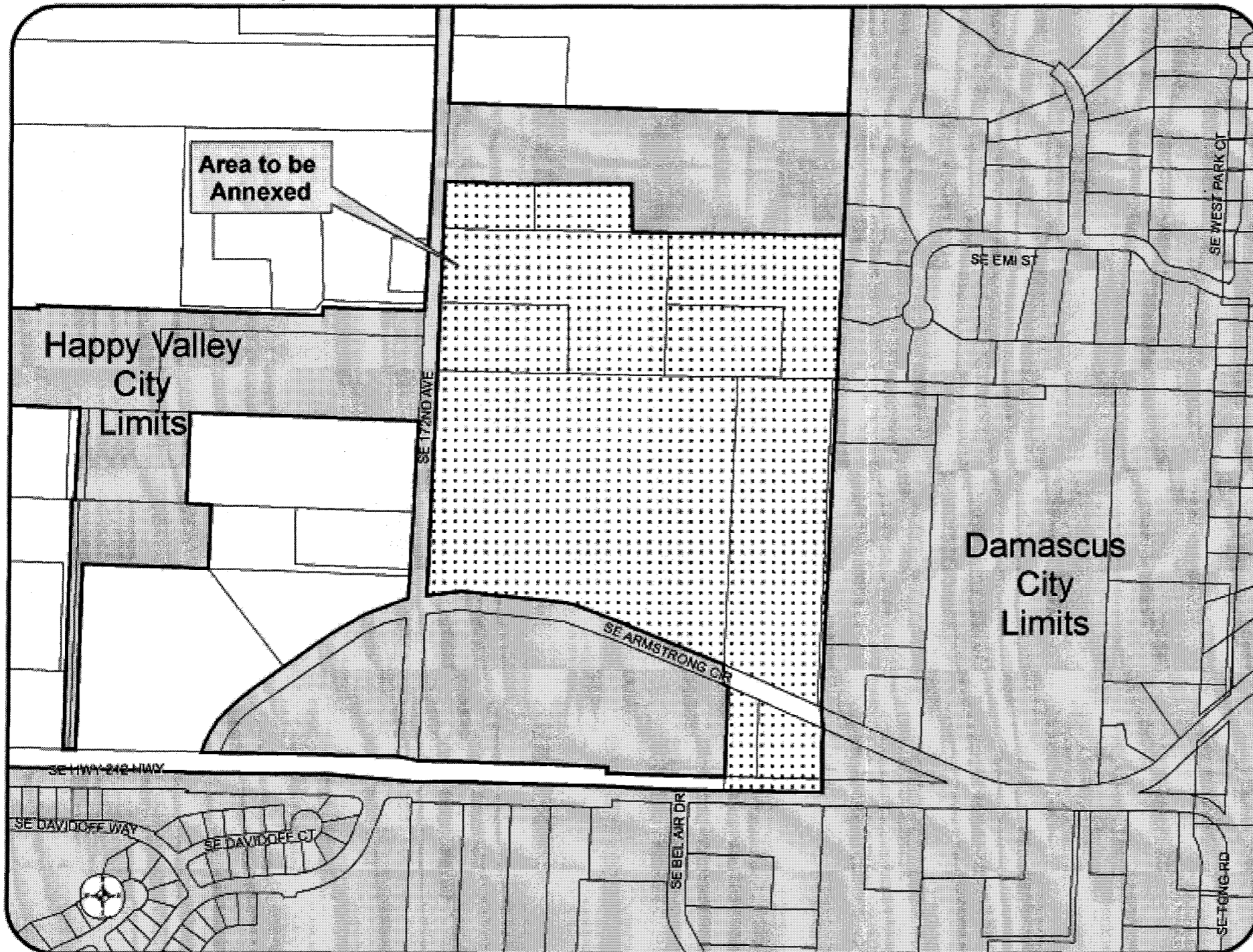

ANNEXATION OF TERRITORY TO THE CITY OF DAMASCUS (AREA ONE)

QUESTION: Shall the described parcel of territory be annexed to the City of Damascus?

SUMMARY: This measure, if approved, would annex to the City of Damascus approximately forty-two (42) contiguous acres of territory, consisting of Lots 301, 500, 600, 601, 602, 603, 700, 800, 1100, and 1200 on Clackamas County Tax Map No. 23E7A. The territory is located west of the Damascus city limits, east of SE 172nd Avenue, south of the Happy Valley city boundary, and north of Armstrong Circle. Upon annexation, the described territory would be located within the City of Damascus, and the City's permanent tax rate of \$3.88 per \$1,000 of assessed value would apply within the annexed territory.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

Measures 3-180 would annex certain parcels of land into the boundaries of the city of Damascus. The city was formed and incorporated by citizen vote in November 2005. Several areas of land between 172nd and 177th avenues that are currently in unincorporated Clackamas County, and which are contiguous with the Damascus city boundary, were not included in the new city for reasons relevant at that time. Since the 2005 incorporation vote, some landowners of this area have petitioned the City of Damascus, requesting to have their properties annexed into the city's boundaries in order to become part of the city of Damascus. In several annexation measures on this ballot, these and additional parcels within the area are being proposed for annexation.

Each ballot measure addresses one of eleven (11) distinct areas, in total comprising approximately 149 land parcels proposed for annexation. The question of annexation of each contiguous parcel must be voted on separately, and only those voters living within each respective area may vote on whether their own particular area should be annexed into the City of Damascus.

The City of Damascus' permanent tax rate of up to \$3.88 per \$1,000 of assessed value would apply to properties approved for annexation, beginning in fiscal year 2006-07. Property tax revenues are used to fund City operations, and will include basic services such as planning, road development and improvement, parks and recreation, and police services. Until otherwise agreed, existing special districts will continue to provide other essential services such as water, storm water management, fire, and emergency medical services within the city.

Properties not approved for annexation will remain unincorporated, and will be available for annexation by adjacent cities.

ARGUMENT IN FAVOR

Back when the initial boundaries for the City of Damascus were being drawn, there were a number of residents and properties in between 172nd and 177th Avenues that wanted to be included within those boundaries. However, several different governments had to agree, so these property "areas" were left out, knowing that we could resolve the situation later, after the incorporation of Damascus.

The incorporation was overwhelmingly approved. Damascus is a city. Now it's possible to go back and include those properties. That's what each of these eleven "annexation" measures is about. We encourage you to vote YES on the measure that applies to the "area" you are in.

You're always welcome in Damascus. We want you to be one of us if you want to be. Many of you have petitioned us for inclusion with Damascus, and that is why all of you are voting on your particular "area." As Oregon's newest city, we are doing things in a way that preserves the values, quality of life and local control that are very important to us, and to our families.

Other governments have tried to stop you from voting to be included within Damascus. The courts have rejected their attempts but they keep trying to keep you from voting on this. Our view is that you are welcome here if you want to be here. We encourage you to vote YES, and become part of the most exciting new city in Oregon.

It seems a little complicated, since there are approximately eleven different areas and measures for annexation or inclusion. But the issue is simple: vote YES to be included in Damascus; vote no if you want to stay where you are until another government annexes you, which they have said they will do.

We encourage you to vote YES, because you are always welcome in Damascus.

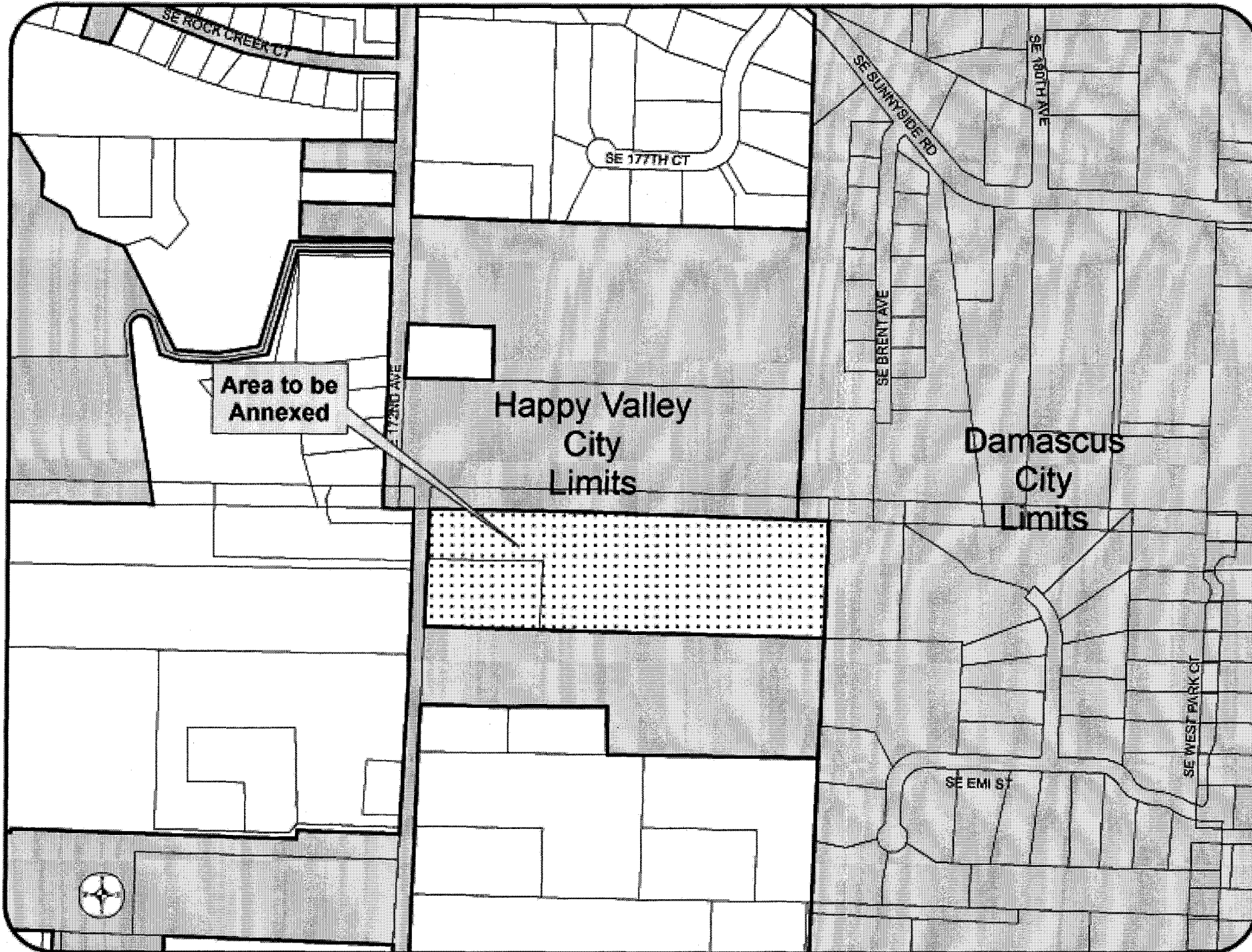

ARGUMENT IN FAVOR

SAY YES! TO DAMASCUS

and NO! to Happy Valley. We have long been part of the Damascus community. We expected to join our neighbors last November in forming the City of Damascus. Interference by the City of Happy Valley prevented us.

NOW WE CAN CHOOSE.

Many rumors regarding supposed tax rates have been circulated in an effort to keep us from making informed choices about the city we choose. In truth, when applied to our properties, the Damascus tax rate currently in effect (Tax Codes 012-115, 012-151, 012-150 and 302-005) is only \$1.25 higher than if we were taken into Happy Valley.

What do we get for the money: a say in the community we actually live in, development that reflects the Core Values articulated by Damascans, and a fiscally healthy city whose voter-approved tax rate is designed to address needs well into the future.

Don't be fooled by Happy Valley's artificially low permanent city tax at 67 cents. The city would be bankrupt if that were the only tax it collected. Residents of that city also pay a \$1.38 per thousand Local Option levy. It is temporary. A new levy will have to replace it. How much will that one be?

In addition, Happy Valley is about to join the North Clackamas Parks District, raising the tax rate by 54 cents. Then the difference from a Damascus rate would be only 71 cents! For many of us, that amounts to the cost of a few lattes a month. Should our future be decided on the basis of so little?

IT'S NOT ABOUT THE TAXES. It's about the quality of life. Damascus has a vision. Happy Valley desperately needs industrial land. Damascus can grow gradually. Happy Valley is in a rush. Damascus has articulated a commitment to green spaces. Hundred-foot firs have been falling throughout Happy Valley at an alarming rate.

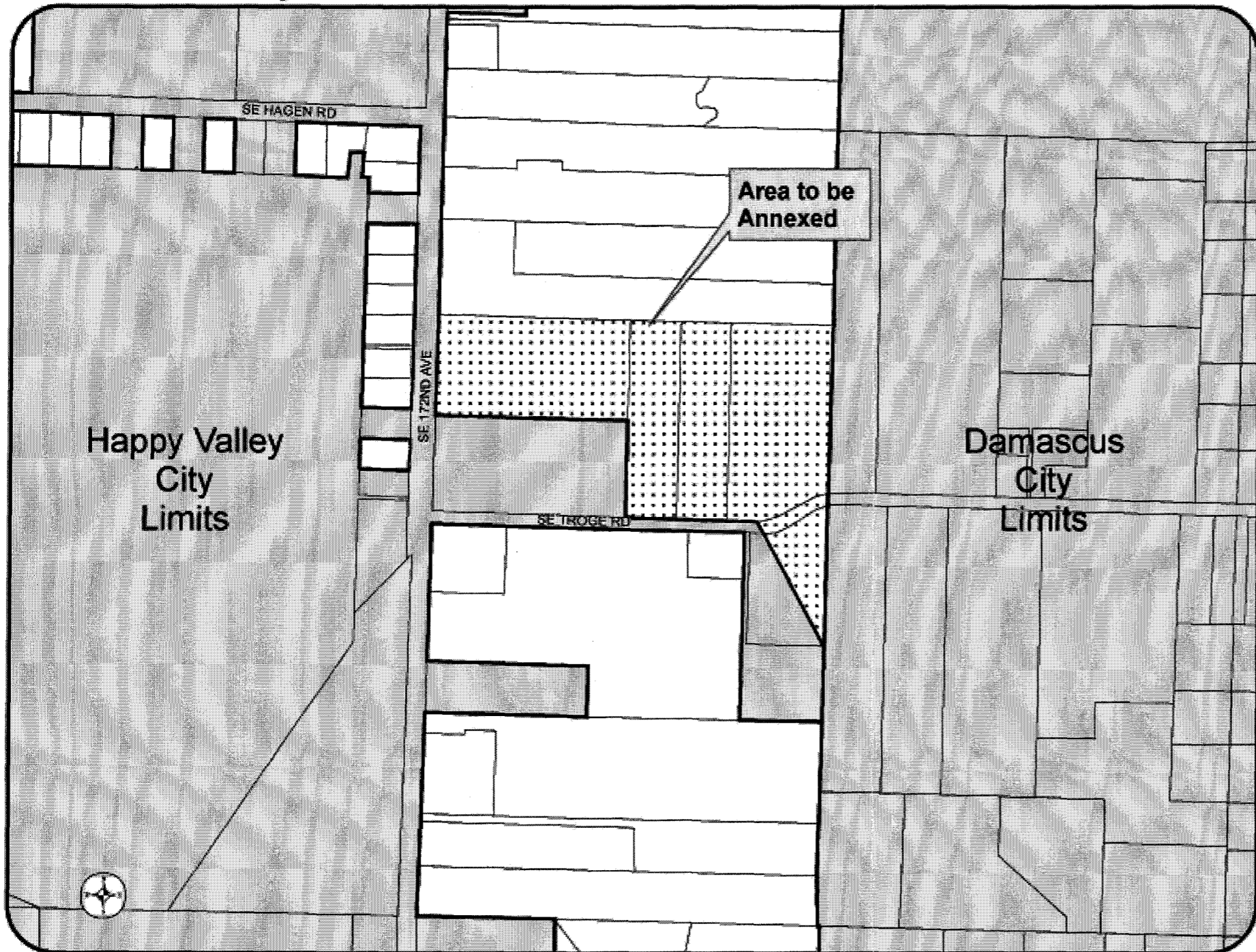

REGISTERING TO VOTE

[SOME FREQUENTLY-ASKED QUESTIONS]

WHO MAY REGISTER TO VOTE?

Anyone who is:

- ★ A resident of Oregon;
- ★ A United States citizen; and
- ★ 18 years of age or older.

HOW MAY I REGISTER?

By mail-in registration form or in person at any county elections office or at a designated state agency, including the Department of Motor Vehicles and some public assistance agencies.

WHEN MAY I REGISTER & WHAT IS THE REGISTRATION DEADLINE?

You may register at any time. However, your voter registration form must be received or postmarked no later than the 21st day before the election at which you intend to vote.

WHERE CAN I FIND VOTER REGISTRATION FORMS?

Post offices, public libraries, city halls, schools, the DMV, and Clackamas County Elections, 825 Portland Avenue in Gladstone. There is a copy of the form in the Qwest Telephone Directory, Blue Government Pages. You can download and print a form in PDF format from the Secretary of State's web site at the Oregon Voter Registration link <http://www.sos.state.or.us/elections/elechp.htm>

WHAT INFORMATION IS REQUIRED?

In October 2002, the "Help America Vote Act" was signed into law. The Act changes voter registration requirements nationwide for voting in federal elections. A person registering to vote is asked to provide identification **only** if they are a new registrant in the county in which they are registering, and they are mailing the registration card via the U.S. Postal Service. Identification is **not** required for updates within the same county, or for any new registrations delivered in person or by means other than mail via the U.S. Postal Service.

Sufficient identification is: a copy of a current, valid photo identification (such as driver's license), or a copy of a paycheck stub, utility bill, bank statement or other government document showing the registrant's name and address.

If identification is not provided at the time of registration, it will be requested by elections officials in order for the person to vote at the next federal election. When filling out the registration card, you must furnish your full name, residence address (and mailing address, if different), date of birth, political party preference, and signature. Your residence address must be the physical address where you reside - not a post office box.

DO I HAVE TO RE-REGISTER FOR EACH ELECTION?

No. You only need to update your registration when your residence (even moving to a different apartment within a complex) or mailing address changes; your name changes; or you wish to change your political party affiliation.

The West Linn City Charter requires voter approval of all annexations of property into city boundaries. The City of West Linn itself has submitted a request to annex 10.2 acres located north of Carriage Way and south of Valley View Drive. The site consists of two discrete parcels, divided by a third parcel owned by the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) and used for a telecommunications facility. The site is also located to the east of the end of Michlen Avenue, a short stub street from Kapteyns Street. The site is currently vacant, and consists of a mixture of forested and open areas. The site is surrounded by single-family residential development. The site is almost entirely surrounded by land within the existing City of West Linn.

The City of West Linn has purchased this land for development of a city park, consistent with the West Linn Parks and Recreation Master Plan, adopted in 1998. If the property is annexed, the city will proceed with planning for specific park improvements. The City expects to execute an agreement with ODOT to use a portion of their property to connect the two city-owned park parcels.

The property is within the Portland Metropolitan Area Urban Growth Boundary. West Linn's Comprehensive Plan Map designates the property for Low-Density Residential Development. The city proposes to have the property zoned R-15, which is a single-family residential zoning district consistent with the Comprehensive Plan Map designation, and which is applied to property to the north and west of this site. However, this zoning district is proposed only because the City has no zoning classification specific to park sites – the City has no intention of using this land for anything other than park and recreation purposes.

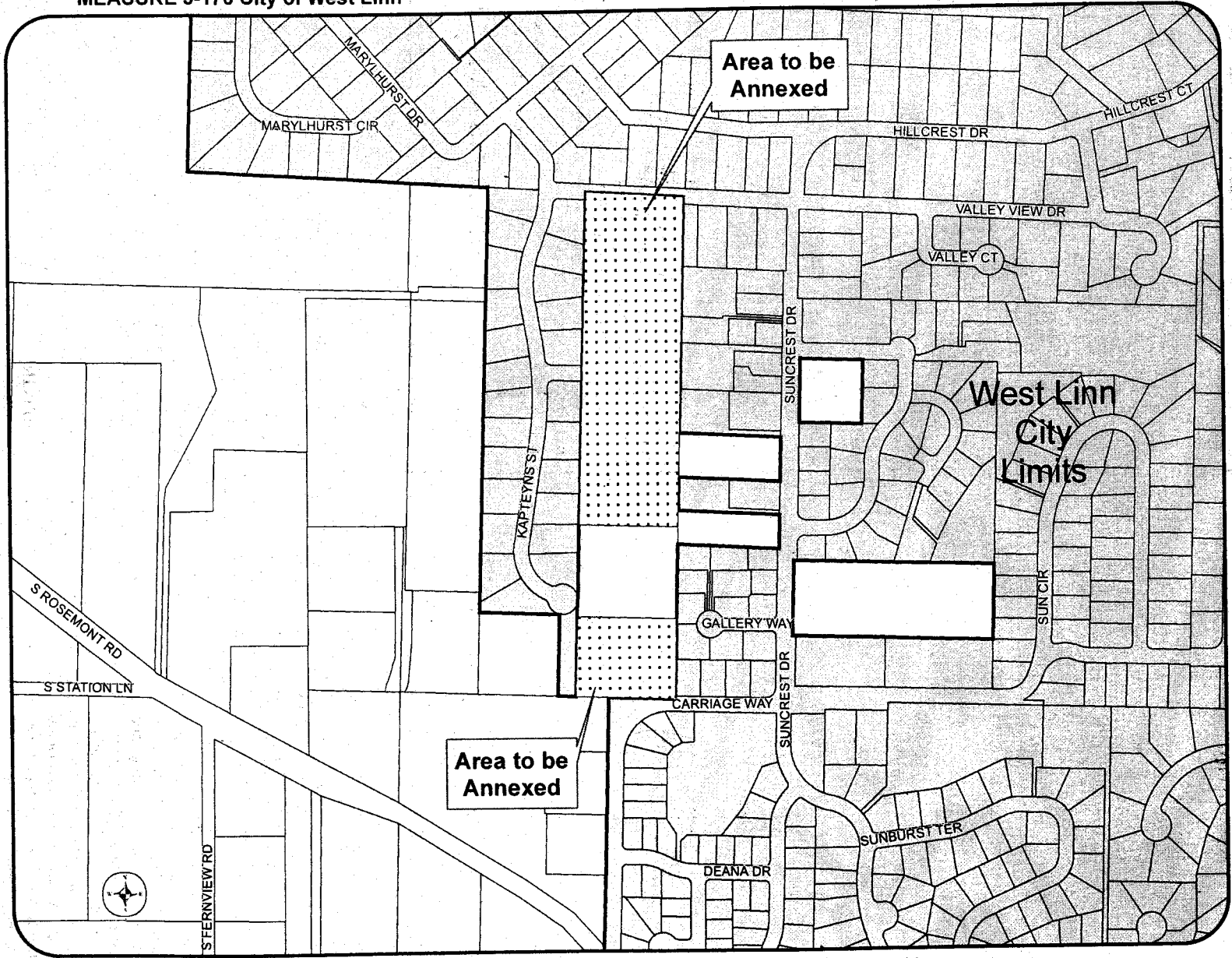
